in june 2010 the common core state standards initiative released common core state standards for english language arts literacy in history social studies science and technical subjects and common core state standards for mathematics the goal of these shared national standards to identify for all stakeholders the knowledge and skills that students must acquire to succeed in college careers and the global economy now that the common core standards are coming to 43 states the district of columbia and puerto

rico it is essential to understand their content and implications understanding common core state standards tells you everything you need to know about the standards including the goals and criteria of the standards and why they are a promising alternative to the old standards based education model the organization and key aspects of the two overarching sets of standards the benefits of implementing the standards including intentional instruction a greater pool of resources increased collegiality and professionalism customized learning and multiple pathways and a more consistent equitable learning experience what schools can do to transition to the new standards and how the common state assessment systems are being developed to provide interactive enhanced test items produce specific timely test results and provide an indication of students readiness for college or career this book is an invitation to think about the possibilities that the common core standards offer for strengthening teaching and learning across the united states and what you can do to make the most of this opportunity for change

the document provides answers to some of the frequently asked questions about the common core state standards from how they were developed to what they mean for states and local communities the questions are organized into the following categories 1 overview 2 process 3 implementation and future work and 4 content and quality of the standards

in recent years federal education legislation has placed an increased emphasis on assessment in schools perhaps most notably title i a of the elementary and secondary education act as reauthorized by the no child left behind act has required all states that receive title i a funds to test all public school students annually in grades three through eight and once in high school in the areas of reading and mathematics in response to this requirement all 50 states and the district of columbia have adopted and implemented standards that meet the requirements of the esea three major changes have taken place that have possibly played a role in the selection of reading and mathematics standards by states the development and release of the common core state standards the race to the top rtt state grant competition and rtt assessment grants competition and the esea flexibility package provided by ed to states with approved applications this book provides a framework for understanding various types of assessments that are administered in elementary and secondary schools examines each of the aforementioned changes and discusses how they are interrelated and discusses various purposes of educational assessment and describes comprehensive assessment systems

copublished with the national council of teachers of mathematics nctm this new volume explores some of the ways high school mathematics content can be made accessible to ell's by building from their strengths and scaffolding their opportunities to learn more

the common core state standards for mathematics and english language arts were released in june of 2010 and have been adopted by a majority of u s states the authors of these standards have claimed that they are internationally benchmarked that is that they are as rigorous focused and coherent as the standards and expectations used in high performing countries but have not provided evidence to back up these claims singapore whose students have scored at the top of recent international assessments is frequently touted as a leader in mathematics education to test the claims of international benchmarking for the common core this paper uses the methodology of the surveys of

enacted curriculum to compare the common core state standards for mathematics to the singapore mathematics framework in terms of rigor focus and coherence the common core state standards and the singapore mathematics framework do call for similar levels of conceptual understanding mathematical reasoning and problem solving however the content expectations outlined by the common core are somewhat more rigorous than those outlined by the singapore mathematics framework

most states have adopted the common core state standards ccss as the basis for evaluating their students this handbook will help teachers and administrators sort through the english language arts standards and focus on the key components of the ccss this is the second of a four book series that started with navigating implementation of ccss the third handbook is navigating mathematics ccss and the fourth is navigating assessment and collaboration with the ccss

the common core state standards ccss are one of the most significant educational initiatives in the last decade aimed at addressing persistently low levels of student achievement in the united states the ccss identify the set of skills that students need at each grade level to ensure they are on a path toward college and career readiness this report describes teachers and administrators experiences preparing for this transition using survey responses from the spring of 2014 and the spring of 2015 survey questions focused on four areas attitudes about the kind of impact the new standards will have and how challenging they are experiences with formal professional development on the new standards opportunities outside of formal training to learn about the new standards and how prepared teachers feel to teach the new standards

as of january 2012 45 states and the district of columbia have adopted the common core state standards ccss in english language arts and mathematics developed through the leadership of the national governors association and the council of chief state school officers released in june 2010 these voluntary standards outline the knowledge and skills in english language arts and math that students in grades kindergarten through 12 are expected to learn to be prepared for college and careers for the past two years the center on education policy cep has tracked states progress in implementing the common core state standards by conducting surveys of deputy state superintendents of education or their designees the authors first survey on this topic took place in fall 2010 just months after the standards were released as described in the 2011 cep report on that survey states progress and challenges in implementing common core state standards the adopting states had taken initial steps to implement the ccss but many did not expect to fully implement some of the more complex standards related changes until 2013 or later in october through december of 2011 the authors conducted a second

survey of deputy superintendents or their designees to gather more recent information about states strategies policies and challenges during the second year of implementing the ccss this report describes findings about the ccss from their 2011 survey the survey also addressed other topics including states fiscal condition and capacity progress in implementing the assurances required by the american recovery and reinvestment act and waivers of elementary and secondary education act requirements that have been or will be covered in other cep reports thirty seven states and the district of columbia which is counted as a state in the tallies in this report responded to the 2011 survey thirty five of these 38 respondents including d c had adopted the ccss in both english language arts and math at the time of the survey while one respondent had adopted the standards in english language arts but not math and two had not adopted the standards in either subject these latter three states are not counted in the totals of adopting states in this report thus the authors survey findings represent the views of a majority of the 46 states including d c that have adopted the standards in both subjects the names of participating states have been kept confidential to encourage frank answers findings reveal that states view the common core state standards as more rigorous than their previous standards according to their survey and are making progress in transitioning to the new standards but states face challenges in fully implementing the standards particularly in finding adequate funding the majority of the ccss adopting states in the authors survey do not expect to fully implement the new standards until school year 2014 15 or later contains 3 figures and 3 tables

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
