adult education is the practice of teaching and educating adults this often happens in the workplace through extension or continuing education courses at secondary schools at a college or university other learning places include folk high schools community colleges and lifelong learning centres the practice is also often referred to as training and development it has also been referred to as andragogy to distinguish it from pedagogy a difference is made between vocational education mostly undertaken in workplaces and frequently related to up skilling and non formal adult education including learning skills or learning for personal development educating adults differs from educating children in several ways one of the most important differences is that adults have accumulated knowledge and experience that can add or hinder the learning experience this

new book presents recent studies on this topic from several perspectives
