this book analyzes teacher quality in latin america and the caribbean which is the key to faster education progress based on new research in 15 000 classrooms in seven different countries it documents the sources of low teacher quality and distills the global evidence on practical policies that can help the region produce great teachers

an in depth look at a profession that is alternately valued and reviled but is consistently a microcosm of society library journal the american teacher a history is as the title makes clear a history of teachers in the united states supported by hundreds of research studies done over the years as reported in scholarly journals the book fills a niche in the history of
