popular music is not simply a series of musicians moments genres or recordings audiences matter and the most ardent audience members are the fans to be a fan is to feel a connection with music the study of fandom has begun to emerge as a vital strand of academic research one that offers a fresh perspective on the nature of music culture dedicated to music investigates fan identities and practices in different

contexts and in relation to different bands and artists through a series of empirical case studies the book reflects a diverse array of objects and perspectives associated with this vibrant new field of study contributors examine how fans negotiate their identities and actively pursue their particular interests touching on a range of issues including cultural capital generational memory gender fan fiction and the use of new media this book was originally published as two special issues of popular music and society

native peoples of north america still face an uncertain future due to their unstable political legal and economic positions views of their predicament continue to be dominated by non indian writers in response a dozen native american writers here reclaim their rightful role as influential voices in debates about native communities these scholars examine crucial issues of politics law and religion in the context of ongoing native american resistance to the dominant culture they particularly show how the writings of vine deloria jr have shaped and challenged american indian scholarship in these areas since 1960s they provide key insights into deloria s thought while introducing some critical issues confronting native nations collectively these essays take up four important themes indigenous societies as the embodiment of cultures of resistance legal resistance to western oppression against indigenous nations contemporary native religious practices and native intellectual challenges to academia essays address indigenous perspectives on topics usually treated by non indians such as role of women in indian society the importance of sacred sites to american indian religious identity and relationship of native language to indigenous autonomy a closing essay by deloria in vintage form reminds native americans of their responsibilities and obligations to one another and to past and future generations this book argues for renewed cultivation of a native american studies that is more indian centered

this new chronological edition is based on the well established topically organized text by bukatko and daehler child development a thematic approach 5 e addressing physical social and emotional development in a linear fashion this text starts with pre natal development and progresses through birth and the newborn baby infancy and toddlerhood early childhood middle childhood and adolescence developed to accommodate the more applied focus of courses in nursing parenthood education family studies and human ecology this

text benefits from the authors focus on research through an emphasis on developmental themes five themes on development are found in every chapter and are listed in the chapter opener called out in the margin where the theme is addressed and summarized in a summary of developmental themes section at the end of the chapter the five themes explore nature and nurture sociocultural contexts continuous vs discontinuous development the domains of development and risk or resilience in development extensive contexts of development chapters for each development stage broaden the scope of the issues discussed by examining the child adolescent within the context of family peers and community research applied to parenting education boxes provide practical advice based on research findings and cover such topics as reducing sids monitoring tv viewing reciprocal teaching and reading to children atypical development sections focus on topics related to non normative development including eating disorders autism attention deficit disorder detecting hearing loss depression conduct disorders and post traumatic stress disorder ptsd summary tables are two page graphic timelines that summarize the various milestones of development and show the sequence of the child's development within a given domain infancy early childhood middle childhood adolescence chapter opening vignettes draw students into real life scenarios by applying and exploring concepts of development marginal features see for yourself and what do you think invite students to critically evaluate and explore further related material on the online study center additional pedagogy includes section summaries within each chapter and comprehensive chapter recap that feature a summary of developmental themes a chapter review and a list of key terms and concepts

in this work of historically informed political theory kimberly smith sets out to understand how nineteenth century americans answered the question of how the people should participate in politics did rational public debate the ideal that most democratic theorists now venerate transcend all other forms of political expression how and why did passion disappear from the ideology if not the practice of american democracy to answer these questions she focuses on the political culture of the urban north during the turbulent jacksonian age roughly 1830 50 when the shape and character of the democratic public were still fluid smith's method is to interpret in light of such popular discourse as newspapers and novels several key texts in nineteenth century american political thought frederick douglass's fourth of july speech and narrative angelina grimke's debate with catharine beecher frances wright's lectures and harriet beecher stowe's uncle tom's cabin such texts smith finds highlight many of the then current ideas about the extremes of political expression her readings support the conclusions that the value of rational argument itself was contested that the emergent enlightenment rationalism may have helped to sterilize political debate and that storytelling or testimony posed an important challenge to the norm of political

rationality smith explores facets of the political culture in ways that make sense of traditions from whiggish resistance to protestant narrative testimony she helps us to understand such puzzles as the point of mob action and other ritualistic disruptions of the political process our simultaneous attraction to and suspicion of political debates and the appeal of stories by and about victims of injustice also found in her book are keen analyses of the antebellum press and the importance of oratory and public speaking smith shows that alternatives to reasoned deliberation like protest resistance and storytelling have a place in politics such alternatives underscore the positive role that interest passion compassion and even violence might play in the political life of america her book therefore is a cautionary analysis of how rationality came to dominate our thinking about politics and why its hegemony should concern us ultimately smith reminds the reader that democracy and reasoned public debate are not synonymous and that the linkage is not necessarily a good thing

a study of the english legal system this new edition brings the book up to date with changes in the law since the first edition major developments include the human rights act 1998 the woolf reforms of civil justice the funding of civil litigation and developments in criminal justice
