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this enquiry into the principles and practice of reading literature brings together insights from cognitive studies literary theory empirical literature studies learning and teaching research and higher education research reading is conceptualised as an active process of meaning making that is determined by subjective as well as contextual factors and guided by a sense of purpose this sense of purpose part of a professional and conscious approach to reading is the central element in the model of reading that this study proposes as well as a conceptual aim this model also has pedagogical power and serves as the basis for a number of critical and creative exercises geared towards developing literary reading strategies and strategic reading competences in general these activities demonstrate how the main tenets of the study can be put into practice within the context of a particular institution of higher education

this book focuses on the propaganda war between the syrian government and the opposition movement which excludes the islamic state and the kurdish led sdf drawing on international relations psychology and media studies the book encourages readers to question the dominant discourse on the war the core of the book outlines the propaganda battles over the main paradigms and narratives that framed the war exploring the shortcomings of those paradigms and narratives identifying who won the propaganda war and why and assessing what impact it had on the military side of the war in particular it focuses on the role of cognitive bias amongst primary and secondary sources in determining the outcome of the propaganda war and whether the influence of this propaganda is best explained by effects or limited effects theory through explaining the dynamics of the propaganda war the book encourages readers to critically question the dominant discourse on the war assists them in understanding primary and secondary reporting on the war and shows that the impact of the propaganda war is best understood in terms of limited effects theory the book s main findings are that i the opposition won the international propaganda war but failed to win the propaganda war inside syria ii propaganda had relatively little effect on shaping attitudes either inside syria or internationally instead its main effect was to reinforce attitudes that had already been shaped by other factors and iii the reality of the war lies between the

conflicting paradigms and narratives being promoted by each side

this book opens a new frontier in understanding nonviolence discussions of peace and nonviolence usually focus on either moral theory or practical dimensions of applying nonviolence in conflict situations teaching peace carries the discussion of nonviolence beyond ethics and into the rest of the academic curriculum this book isn't just for religion or philosophy teachers it is for all educators teaching peace begins with a discussion rooted in christian theology where nonviolence is so central and important but it is clear that there are other paths to nonviolence and that one certainly doesn't have to be a christian to practice nonviolence the pieces that follow therefore show how a nonviolent perspective impacts disciplines across the curriculum from acting to biology to mathematics to psychology
