this book the 72nd and last in the annual series summarizes approximately 500 reports of reading research identified between july 1 1995 and june 30 1996 the research studies in the book are categorized into 6 major areas 1 summaries of reading research 2 teacher preparation and practice 3 sociology of reading 4 physiology and psychology of reading 5 the

teaching of reading and 6 reading of atypical learners all but the first category in the book are further subcategorized and individual studies within subcategories are grouped by subject an author index and a list of journals monitored conclude the book rs
