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due to the development of the international education for all and education for sustainable development movements for which unesco is the lead agency there has been an increasing emphasis on the power of education and schooling to help build more just and equitable societies thus giving everyone the opportunity to develop their talents to the full regardless of characteristics such as gender socio economic status ethnicity religious persuasion or regional location as enshrined in the united nations declaration on human rights over five decades ago everyone has the right to receive a high quality and relevant education in order to try to achieve this ideal many countries are substantially re engineering their education systems with an increasing emphasis on promoting equity and fairness and on ensuring that everyone has access to a high quality and relevant education they are also moving away from the traditional outlook of almost exclusively stressing formal education in schools as the most valuable way in which people learn to accepting that important and valuable learning does not just occur in formal dedicated education institutions but also through informal and non formal means thus learning is both lifelong and life wide this book brings together the experience and research of 40 recognised and experienced opinion leaders in education around the world the book investigates the most effective ways of ensuring the unesco aim of effective education for all people in the belief that not only should education be a right for all but also that education and schooling has the potential to transform individual lives and to contribute to the development of more just humane and equitable societies

this guide presents a description of the standards and related skills school leaders must master and apply since every school leader needs a well defined philosophy to make decisions the guide emphasizes philosophical performance and ethical dimensions of school leadership the book s 10 chapters address such issues as visionary leadership including the skills and disposition needed to lead others to peak performance the political skills needed for school governance in a democracy the proficiency in communication and community relations required for articulating a vision the skills in organizational management insights on developing a curriculum design and delivery system for diverse school communities expertise in instructional management and the development of a data based student achievement system the related need to focus on staff evaluation and staff development the knowledge that school leaders need to

over the past ten years a variety of leadership theories and practices have both influenced and responded to widespread changes in education this volume examines the technical managerial and institutional dimensions of leadership and shows how they relate to changing views of teaching and learning to new forms of school organization and governance and to shifting trends in the social and community climate of schooling

for five years mcdonald charted the progress of ten schools in the coalition of essential schools as they immersed themselves in the hard work of school reform he also visited many other schools both elementary and secondary in an attempt to understand serious school reform and its prospects he concludes that school reform requires redesign in three critical areas the first is a shift in the ordinary and often tacit beliefs of the people who work in schools the communities that support them and even the children who attend them the second area which mcdonald dubs the wiring arena involves internal communication and power arrangements the third area called tuning involves connecting the school to the needs interests and values of the communities it serves

colleagues and former students helped complete the story of dr isherwood s career after his death in 1998 a professor at mcgill university for 26 years he touched many lives in the classroom and in native communities his unfinished memoir completed by his students and peers is the story of educational administration in north america between 1958 and 1998 his wisdom and faith in others are echoed in the narratives

although teachers are recognized as one of the most important factors in the

effective education of children much of the power they possess remains unexamined teaching in mind offers teachers a variety of ways to explore their own beliefs values meanings metaphors and presuppositions that often result in conflict in an educational setting it helps teachers reflect on and evaluate their thinking envision their ideal classroom and select teaching methods to support their vision teaching in mind encourages teachers to value their own expertise and to take their place as leaders in educational improvement
