the routledge handbook of language and emotion offers a variety of critical theoretical and methodological perspectives that interrogate the ways in which ideas about and experiences of emotion are shaped by linguistic encounters and vice versa taking an interdisciplinary approach which incorporates disciplines such as linguistic anthropology sociolinguistics applied linguistics psychology communication studies education sociology folklore religious studies and literature this book explores and illustrates the relationship between language and emotion in the five key areas of language socialisation culture translation and transformation poetry pragmatics and power the affective body self and emotion communities situates our present day thinking about language and emotion by providing a historical and

cultural overview of distinctions and moral values that have traditionally dominated western thought relating to emotions and their management provides a unique insight into the multiple ways in which language incites emotion and vice versa especially in the context of culture with contributions from an international range of leading and emerging scholars in their fields the routledge handbook of language and emotion is an indispensable resource for students and researchers who are interested in incorporating interdisciplinary perspectives on language and emotion into their work

affect and emotion includes a variety of chapters by some of the most prominent scholars in the area of emotions and leadership as well as chapters by rising stars these chapters chart the direction of future research in affect and leadership in four main areas first several of these chapters make a convincing argument that leaders use emotional labor and other forms of emotional displays to influence followers and team members leaders may use emotional labor to manage relational identities or to create favorable impressions on followers and to create trust leaders active emotional displays increase vision related performance and perception of transformational leadership second one chapter reveals how emotions play an important role in leadership at every level from within person to organization wide leadership leader s emotional labor plays an important role in several of these levels with the exact method of performing emotional labor varying by level a second chapter also examines levels of leadership with a particular examination of the effects of leader emotional labor on close and distant leadership third several of the chapters examine emotions from the authentic leadership and positive leadership perspectives and two of these chapters focus on how psychological capital and authentic leadership skills help leaders be resilient and overcome obstacles fourth two of the chapters show the role of affect and friendship ties to leadership research one of these chapters examines the need to develop psychometrically sound measures of affect and friendship whereas the other develops a model of how affect influences social network ties and informal leadership emergence taken together these chapters illustrate four important research trends in emotions and leadership that are likely to grow in importance in the coming years

comprehensively examining the relationship between cognition and emotion this authoritative handbook brings together leading investigators from multiple psychological subdisciplines biological underpinnings of the cognition emotion interface are reviewed including the role of neurotransmitters and hormones contributors explore how key cognitive processes such as attention learning and memory shape emotional phenomena and vice versa individual differences in areas where cognition and emotion interact such as agreeableness and emotional intelligence are addressed the volume also analyzes the roles of cognition and emotion in anxiety depression borderline personality disorder and other psychological disorders

the handbook consists of four major sections each section is introduced by a main article theories of emotion general aspects perspectives in communication theory semiotics and linguistics perspectives on language and emotion in cultural studies interdisciplinary and applied perspectives the first section presents interdisciplinary emotion theories relevant for the field of language and communication research including the history of emotion research the second section focuses on the full range of emotion related aspects in linguistics semiotics and communication theories the next section focuses on cultural studies and language and emotion emotions

in arts and literature as well as research on emotion in literary studies and media and emotion the final section covers different domains social practices and applications such as society policy diplomacy economics and business communication religion and emotional language the domain of affective computing in human machine interaction and language and emotion research for language education overall this handbook represents a comprehensive overview in a rich diverse compendium never before published in this particular domain

the handbook language and emotion is intended to give a historical and systematic profile of the area it will aim to connect contemporary and historical theories approaches and applications and to cover eastern and western perspectives of language communication and emotion it will present all relevant aspects of language and emotion and thus contribute significantly to research in the field of linguistics and semiotics of emotion

the mind is a powerful anticipatory device it frequently makes predictions about the future telling us not only how the world might or will be but also how it should be or better how we would like it to be these expectancies shape our lives they impact on our actual outcomes often acting as self fulfilling prophecies they also constitute a reference point for establishing whether an outcome is a loss or a gain that is we evaluate our own outcomes not in absolute terms but against our expectancies and we feel ill treated and betrayed when our expectancies are disappointed this book explores anticipation based emotions that is the emotions associated with the dialectical interaction between what is and what is not yet be it a mere wished for possibility or an expectation proper it offers an analysis of both the emotions implying anticipations of future events such as fear anxiety hope and trust and those elicited by the disconfirmation of a previous anticipation surprise disappointment discouragement sense of injustice regret and relief in terms of their belief and goal components in addition it addresses anticipated emotions

that is emotions we think we might experience in future circumstances and explores how they influence our decisions the reader will be taken on a journey of exploration and discovery into the multifarious facets and implications of an important family of emotions aimed at understanding what they have in common as well as the distinguishing features of each distinct emotion and predicting their motivational and behavioral consequences for students and researchers interested in the affective sciences including psychology philosophy and neuroscience this is a highly original and thought provoking new work

despite the many attempts to disentangle the relationship between morality and emotion as is clear from the myriad of approaches that try to understand the nature and importance of their connection the extent of this synergy remains rather controversial the multidisciplinary framework of the present volume was specifically designed to challenge self containing disciplinary views encouraging a more integrative analysis that covers various methodological angles and theoretical perspectives contributions include discussions on the interrelation between moral philosophy emotion and identity namely the clash between grand ethical theories and the practicality of human life philosophical considerations on akrasia or the so called weakness of will and the factors behind it anthropological reflections on empathy and prosocial behavior accounts from artificial intelligence and evolutionary game theory and literary and artistic dissections of emotional responses to the representational power of fiction and the image the inclusion of chapters from varied scientific backgrounds substantially enriches this debate and shows that several core questions such as the ones related to identity and to the way we perceive the other and ourselves are transversal it is therefore valuable and pressing to further explore these common threads and to encourage disciplinary dialogues across both traditional and emerging fields to help shed new light on the puzzling and fascinating ways in which morality and emotion are mutually imbricated
