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It is surprising that there is so little research on textbooks given their centrality to teaching and learning in elementary and secondary schools. Textbooks have become a focus of political and cultural controversy advocating a multicultural curriculum that has sparked some vigorous protests. Research is absent in this debate; therefore, questions of legitimate knowledge, the role of textbooks, textbook design, policy selection issues, and economic issues concerning the marketplace are not part of the current debate without insights of research on considerate text mentioning illustrations and so forth. The current controversy will result in publishers responding to demands for more content, not less; thus, textbooks will become compendia of information that on the surface satisfy everyone. This volume demonstrates how research on important issues relative to textbook design can advance our knowledge about what makes textbooks effective learning tools and thus inform policymakers, publishers, and those involved in textbook selection.

representing pure and applied approaches researchers present papers on the quality of writing the role of questions the role of pictures and illustrations and the role of auxiliary materials in the design of effective textbooks the chapters provide insight into research and its application to textbook design and improvement stimulating others to follow this lead

clientelism and implementing social security programmes in post conflict iraqi kurdistan region investigates social policy in a politically less developed entity and examines the mainstream top down and bottom up models of policy implementation in light of a detailed study of the kurdistan regional government in addition it introduces the innovative clientelistic model of policy implementation a political and preferential tool which utilises a public nationalistic dichotomy in social welfare provision the book argues that politicians in the kurdistan region deal with social policy programmes according to their political preferences attaching importance to policies on the basis of the way they feel about those social programmes and interest groups concerned as such as it stands policy implementation is subject to interference by politicians and high government officials under the pretext of supporting and monitoring the way such policy is implemented through an investigation of the most prominent actors in the implementation of social security programmes this book demonstrates how beneficiaries of these programmes can themselves become focal points in the implementation process indeed within the kurdistan regional government s social policy context today the benefits of social security schemes are being distributed based on the socio political status of recipients not on their socio economic conditions and needs

the politics of the textbook analyzes the factors that shape production distribution and reception of school texts through original essays which emphasize the double edged quality of textbooks textbooks are viewed as systems of moral regulation in the struggle of powerful groups to build political and cultural accord they are also regarded as the site of popular resistance around disclosing the interest underlying schoolknowledge and incorporating alternative traditions
