this book includes revised dissertation chapters from the author s second phd which was awarded in 2020 by murdoch university australia it also includes three chapters summarising recent developments this was an innovative transdisciplinary research project using phenomenology as the over arching meta paradigm the investigation involved collaborations and literature reviews across numerous disciplines including philosophy geography ethnoecology sociology and cultural studies the book discusses three landscape language ethnophysiography case studies with indigenous peoples in australia and the usa it features a detailed discussion of transdisciplinarity and provides a comprehensive example of how this approach can be applied to complex dwelling relationships which people from different cultures have with specific topographic environments turning terrain into landscape it involves using phenomenology as a transdisciplinary meta paradigm and describes phenomenological methods for integrating physical and social sciences including an analysis of the worldviews of indigenous peoples for example manyjilyjarra jukurrpa as heideggerian topology

this book presents thinking about and through transdisciplinary and professional development as an educative process rather than focusing on the delineation of the approaches offered an analysis of these contributions points to commonality in those problems that benefit from a transdisciplinary perspective the core elements of transdisciplinarity can lead to what might be called metanoia another way of knowing a knowing which is beyond that which is creative and transformative this poses challenges for the practice of all professionals and is the core issue that this book addresses the book brings together the constituting views of transdisciplinarity or metanoia and focus them on current professional practice the book is structured in two parts and five sections the first part deals with key issues in transdisciplinarity its actuality and how it creates knowledge section 1 has three original papers which look at transdisciplinarity from a different lens especially the islamic voice has not been heard in this context before section 2 considers the knowledge aspect of

transdisciplinarity and how this might be confronted with existing disciplinary knowledge part 2 of the book is directly focused on professionals and their education the third section considers research pedagogy and graduate education for the professional this is followed in section 4 which offers a discussion on team work in the final section six chapters present the transdisciplinary practitioner in different contexts

in this fascinating volume the contributors make it very clear that far from being a faddish and superficial phenomenon transdisciplinarity is potentially the foundation for a new and much needed approach to inquiry transdisciplinarity goes beyond the dualism of opposing binary pairs subject object subjectivity objectivity matter consciousness nature divine simplicity complexity reductionism holism diversity unity which have marked the history of ideas for millennia because transdisciplinarity is radical in the sense that it goes to the roots of knowledge and questions our way of thinking and our construction and organization of knowledge it requires a discipline of self inquiry that integrates the knower in the process of knowing niculescu's vision of transdisciplinarity and that of the international contributors to this volume goes beyond cognicentrism and the focus on analytic intelligence to propose a new type of intelligence that reflects a harmony between mind feelings and body

landscape researchers and managers are often asked help solve environmental and societal problems and so must develop interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary skills interdisciplinary research creates new knowledge by integrating people from the humanities social sciences and natural sciences transdisciplinary research adds an extra level of integration by involving non academic stakeholders this book describes the opportunities and limitations of these approaches it discusses the expectations of policy makers funding bodies stakeholders and
