this volume is the first comprehensive english handbook on japanese dialects the study of japanese dialects has a rich tradition contributing to fields like geolinguistics sociolinguistics and phonology while influenced by western linguistics japanese dialectology has also made significant original contributions through extensive fieldwork and compilation of dialect dictionaries and atlases most studies have been published in japanese allowing only a handful of foreign specialists to take full advantage of the achievements in japanese dialectology this handbook addresses that gap

making dialect data and analyses available to a broader audience and informing specialists about japanese dialectology's methods and achievements it focuses on mainland dialects including the hachijō language while a separate handbook covers the ryukyuan languages now regarded as sister languages of japanese

this grammar has been written to help the student to think in the japanese way part one contains several introductory notes on nomenclature syntax verbs aru iru oru on adjectives and on foreign words part two concentrates on connectives the particles and suffixes which modify the sense of other words or show the relationship of these words to each other these connectives the heart of japanese grammar present unusual difficulty to foreign students arranged alphabetically in dictionary form each word is followed by a textual explanation of how it is used and of its various meanings with cautions as to its translation the forms covered include not only those of the standard colloquial literary or bungo styles but also the more common colloquialisms and provincial forms whether or not these are strictly grammatical no other text available makes as thorough or as complete a classification

from the very earliest stages of study until far into the intermediate level students of the japanese language are continually scratching their heads over the usage of verbs it is no wonder that they should feel the need for a solid reference book one they can continually turn to throughout their studying careers the handbook of japanese verbs is just that book the introduction takes the first step toward comprehension by pointing out the features of japanese verbs that stand in contrast to their english counterparts such as tense politeness level auxiliaries and transitive and intransitive forms part 1 shows through tables and concise commentary how japanese verbs are categorized conjugated and combined with auxiliaries each form is followed by a short exercise reinforcing the points just made part 2 takes up the forms described in the first part and shows how they function in full fledged sentences each discussion is followed by examples and exercises ensuring that the student has understood the forms under discussion in the appendices the student is offered a number of look up methods including an english japanese verb dictionary this completes the apparatus necessary for a solid handbook on japanese verbs a book students can rely on for many years to come
