cannot be taken for granted in a broad range of areas relevant to disability equity and transformation an eclectic group of contributors critically consider whether when and how citizenship may be used as a lever of change in circumstances far removed from un boardrooms in new york or geneva debate is polyvocal with voices from the south engaging with those from the north disabled people with nondisabled and activists and politicians intersecting with researchers and theoreticians along the way accepted wisdoms on a host of issues in disability and international development are enriched and problematized the volume explores what life for disabled people in low and middle income countries tells us about subjects such as identity and intersectionality labour and the global market family life and intimate relationships migration climate change access to the digital world participation in sport and the performing arts and much else
