from actual church services and these are examined in detail in the book itself thérèse smith is in the music department university college dublin

the first biography of arguably the most influential gospel artist of the 20th century brought to life through interviews with his collaborators friends and family gospel singer and seven time grammy winner andraé crouch 1942 2015 hardly needs introduction his compositions the blood will never lose its power through it all jesus is the answer soon and very soon and others set the gold standard for gospel music and remain staples in modern hymnals today he is often spoken of in the same genius pantheon as mahalia jackson thomas dorsey and the rev james cleveland and was lauded as the foremost gospel singer of his generation by former president barack and first lady michelle obama upon his death in 2015 in soon and very soon authors robert darden and stephen newby celebrate the countless ways that crouch indelibly changed the course of gospel and popular music not least among them was crouch s progressive pursuit to address the sociopolitical issues of his time including aids prejudice abuse housing insecurity and addiction with his twin sister sandra crouch served as minister of the church their father founded and ministered to individuals experiencing these issues despite ongoing criticism from some church members

crouch s group the disciples were the first bi racial musical ensemble in gospel music and performed in a range of venues from mega churches to madison square garden and carnegie hall in addition to network television programs ranging from soul train to the tonight show starring johnny carson to saturday night live in doing so crouch and his disciples introduced jazz funk classical calypso latin and other musical elements into gospel by the peak of his career crouch s influence was so pervasive that he recorded performed with and composed for some of the most powerful names in popular music including michael jackson elvis presley elton john bob dylan paul simon quincy jones little richard stevie wonder and madonna to illuminate the vivid world in which crouch lived darden and newby include interviews with surviving musicians collaborators friends and family members complete with musical analysis of crouch s compositions and lyrics as a major intervention in gospel and popular music studies soon and very soon tells the fascinating and dynamic story of one of the true giants in american popular music

the first book to cover a uniquely transformative period in the life of one of the 20th century s most lasting icons nearly 50 years after his death louis armstrong remains one of the 20th century s most iconic figures popular fans still appreciate his later hits such as hello dolly what a wonderful world and la vie en rose while in the jazz community he remains venerated for his groundbreaking innovations in the 1920s the achievements of armstrong s middle years however possess some of the trumpeter s most scintillating and career defining stories but the story of this crucial time has never been told in depth until now between 1929 and 1947 armstrong transformed himself from a little known trumpeter in chicago to an internationally renowned pop star setting in motion the innovations of the swing era and bebop he had a similar effect on the art of american pop singing waxing some of his most identifiable hits such as jeepers creepers when you re smilling and when the saints go marching in along the way he became the first black man to host a nationally sponsored radio show and to receive featured billing in a hollywood film however as author ricky

riccardi shows armstrong s most transformative era wasn t without its problems from racist performance reviews and being held up at gunpoint by gangsters to struggling with an overworked embouchure and getting arrested for marijuana possession utilizing a prodigious amount of new research riccardi traces the armstrong s mid career fall from grace why his career faltered the ways in which the rise of swing and bop affected his musical approach and identity the sacrifices he made to reenter the limelight and the choices he made during this period that ultimately led to his resurgence as an iconic vocalist and performer whose nuance influenced the musical stylings of bing crosby billie holiday and countless others for decades to follow featuring never before published photographs and brand new stories culled from armstrong s personal archives heart full of rhythm the big band years of louis armstrong tells the story of how the man called pops became the first king of pop

charles keil examines the expressive role of blues bands and performers and stresses the intense interaction between performer and audience profiling bluesmen bobby bland and b b king keil argues that they are symbols for the black community embodying important attitudes and roles success strong egos and close ties to the community while writing urban blues in the mid 1960s keil optimistically saw this cultural expression as contributing to the rising tide of raised political consciousness in afro america his new afterword examines black music in the context of capitalism and black culture in the context of worldwide trends toward diversification enlightening keil has given a provocative indication of the role of the blues singer as a focal point of ghetto community expression john s wilson new york times book review a terribly valuable book and a powerful one keil is an original thinker and has offered us a major breakthrough studs terkel chicago tribune urban blues expresses authentic concern for people who are coming to realize that their past was the source of meaningful cultural values atlantic an achievement of the first magnitude he opens our eyes and introduces a world of amazingly complex musical happening robert farris thompson ethnomusicology keil s vigorous aggressive scholarship lucid style and sparkling

12 bar blues bible by andrew d gordon is a thoroughly groovy compendium of over 50 12 bar riffs that span the full range of blues styles blues jazz blues minor blues funky blues country blues rock blues latin blues gospel blues each riff is accompanied by a demonstration audio files there is a host of stylistic detail to help you capture the right grooves before you know it you II be jamming and improvising your very own blues solos the latter part of the book contains a chapter on the basics of blues improvisation for anyone who is just starting out in the world of improvising using the blues as a starting point there are seven jam along tracks each about three minutes in length so that you may try out examples in the book or your own improvisational ideas along with a rhythm section of organ bass and drums

country riffs for piano keyboards by andrew d gordon is a book with 45 examples showing how to play professional sounding country western swing bluegrass honky tonk blues country rock and country pop styles learn to play fills or riffs to such country favorites as rocky top san antonio rose on the road again desperado sweet home alabama orange blossom special etc the audio files are recorded with piano left hand on the left stereo channel and the piano right hand on the right stereo channel along with rhythm accompaniment of bass drums organ and either violin banjo guitar or accordion depending on the track all the 45 examples are recorded with the accompaniment on their own and many of the examples are recorded a third time at a slowed down tempo the nashville numbering system is also explained and how it is used in playing country music

for several centuries cape town has accommodated a great variety of musical genres which have usually been associated with specific population groups living in and around the city musical styles and genres produced in cape town have therefore been assigned an identity which is first and foremost social this volume tries to question the relationship established between musical styles and genres and social in this case pseudo racial identities in sounding the cape denis constant martin recomposes and examines through the theoretical prism of creolisation the history of music in cape town deploying analytical tools borrowed from the most recent studies of identity configurations he demonstrates that musical creation in the mother city and in south

africa has always been nurtured by contacts exchanges and innovations whatever the efforts made by racist powers to separate and divide people according to their origin musicians interviewed at the dawn of the 21st century confirm that mixture and blending characterise all cape town s musics they also emphasise the importance of a rhythmic pattern particular to cape town the ghoema beat whose origins are obviously mixed the study of music demonstrates that the history of cape town and of south africa as a whole undeniably fostered creole societies yet twenty years after the collapse of apartheid these societies are still divided along lines that combine economic factors and racial categorisations martin concludes that were music given a greater importance in educational and cultural policies it could contribute to fighting these divisions and promote the notion of a nation that in spite of the violence of racism and apartheid has managed to invent a unique common culture

many musicians including some that are technically quite advanced never break away from the printed page to learn by simply listening and re creating the common name for this process is playing by ear with some basic guidelines any musician with rudimentary skills can teach himself or herself to play by ear adding a new dimension to their playing skills this book teaches the 5 string banjoist to listen and play solos and chord progressions by ear providing essential ear training and techniques needed to participate in jam sessions of all types chapters include learning chord progressions by ear faking a solo playing the melody by ear and using licks written in tablature only the companion recording is in split track format with the melody track on the left and the rhythm on the right

a rip snorting rock n roll memoir from the legendary disc jockey who s been called the missing link to the sixties there was a small sliver of time between bebop and hip hop when a new generation of teenagers created rock n roll clay cole was one of those teenagers as the host of his own saturday night pop music television show sh boom is the pop culture chronicle of that exciting time 1953 to 1968 when teenagers created

their own music from swing bands and pop to rhythm and blues cover records a cappella rockabilly folk rock and girl groups from the british invasion to the creation of the american boy band he was the first to introduce chubby checker performing the twist the first to present the rolling stones tony orlando dionne warwick neil diamond bobby vinton the rascals the ronettes the four seasons dion and dozens more the first to introduce music video clips discotheque go go girls and young unknown standup comedians richard pryor george carlin and fannie flagg to a teenage television audience but after fifteen years of fame clay walked away from his highly popular saturday night show at the age of thirty and remained out of the spotlight for over forty years well he s missing no longer he s back with a remarkable story to tell brimming with the gossip scandal and heartbreak of the upstart billion dollar music biz sh boom is a breezy behind the scenes look at live television mom and pop record companies and a boozy mafia run manhattan during the early days of rock n roll

the long awaited definitive biography of the king of soul timed to coincide with the 50th anniversary of redding s iconic performance at the 1967 monterey pop festival otis redding remains an immortal presence in the canon of american music on the strength of such classic hits as sittin on the dock of the bay i ve been loving you too long try a little tenderness and respect a song he wrote and recorded before aretha franklin made it her own as the architect of the distinctly southern gospel inflected style of rhythm blues associated with stax records in memphis redding made music that has long served as the gold standard of 1960s soul yet an aura of myth and mystery has always surrounded his life which was tragically cut short at the height of his career by a plane crash in december 1967 in otis redding an unfinished life jonathan gould finally does justice to redding s incomparable musical artistry drawing on exhaustive research the cooperation of the redding family and previously unavailable sources of information to present the first comprehensive portrait of the singer s background his upbringing and his professional career in chronicling the story of redding s life and music gould also presents a social history of the time and place

from which they emerged his book never lets us forget that the boundaries between black and white in popular music were becoming porous during the years when racial tensions were reaching a height throughout the united states his indelible portrait of redding and the mass acceptance of soul music in the 1960s is both a revealing look at a brilliant artist and a provocative exploration of the tangled history of race and music in america that resonates strongly with the present day

due to the runaway success of the 100 ultimate blues riffs andrew d gordon s latest book 100 ultimate jazz riffs consists of as the title suggests 100 jazz riffs based on common chord progressions used in jazz such as the ii v i iii v etc there are five separate ections jazz swing jazz ballad jazz funk jazz waltz and latin jazz each musical example has a single note improvised melody line with the right hand and chord accompaniment with the left hand at the end of the book there is the chord progression for the popular jazz standard blue moon showing you how to use various examples from the 100 riffs to create an improvised solo over the chord progression by demonstrating this technique you can pick most jazz standards and create your own improvisational ideas using the book the audio files are recorded with the right hand piano part on the right channel and the left hand piano part on the left channel bass and drums on both channels with most of the examples recorded at normal and slowed down tempos an absolute must for musicians learning and playing various jazz styles

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
