rehabilitation and as an important component of the development of the field itself the text is supported by rich ancillaries for educators including instructor s manual powerpoints and test bank new to the third edition new chapter authors are high caliber experts with unique voices and perspectives who have partnered with senior scholars from previous editions this new edition is significantly updated to reflect emerging trends that are impacting the professional practice of rehabilitation counseling updated chapter on technology in rehabilitation counseling includes distance education assistive technology and telemental health new chapter on counseling and mental health key features conceptualizes rehabilitation counseling and its complementary relationship to counseling each chapter addresses cacrep standards and includes learning objectives reflection activities and content review questions extensively addresses both aspects of cacrep specialty identity traditional rehabilitation counseling and clinical rehabilitation counseling includes appendices with a guide to key acronyms and scope of practice case conceptualizations focuses on the delivery of services

this text represents a complete revision and update that provides the reader with a comprehensive overview and introduction to the field of rehabilitation counseling and services but also has applicability to the growing field of community counseling part one the introductory section discusses and describes the basic foundations of the rehabilitative process part two the rehabilitation process provides the reader with an insightful appreciation and understanding of the rehabilitation process in part three the counseling and psychosocial aspects of disability are traced from multiple points of view both theoretical and practical and psychodynamic adlerian rational emotive behavioral and gestalt perspectives are explored and examined the final section discusses special topics in rehabilitation appropriate for an introductory textbook but more suitable for an in depth examination the book s revisions include in part a greatly expanded chapter on the foundations of rehabilitation as well as a new historical aspects chapter educational considerations have been expanded and incorporated into a chapter on the development of the rehabilitation counseling discipline material on the rehabilitation process and occupational analysis and placement has been reorganized and includes new material on job development and placement new material has been included on counseling credentialing and substance use

disabilities and material on international and multicultural perspectives has been reorganized and updated this outstanding text will be particularly useful in graduate introductory rehabilitation or community counseling courses and may be readily adaptable to undergraduate courses as well additionally the book will be a very useful resource for rehabilitation or community counselor practitioners

this second edition is a major revision and update of rehabilitation and disability psychosocial case studies the role and function of the rehabilitation counselor is described relative to the principles and practices of case management in the vocational rehabilitation process the first chapter describes landmark legislation that has ensured the human and civil rights of persons with disabilities the author relates changes to those of the consumerism movement as persons with disabilities move from passive recipients of services to active participants capable of steering their own future choosing their jobs and environments assessment as a best practice has expanded from being agency oriented to being person oriented in addition to the use of best practices the author advocates the use of best values to serve as the decision making foundation for the application of best practices values can be the standards that guide the entire rehabilitation service delivery process including the formulation of objectives the search for alternatives and the choices among them the goal is for the client to realize the american dream the first two parts of the text provide a person based philosophy and a substantial knowledge base in case management and the thirteen case studies in the third part allow the reader to investigate the use of best practices and best values in case management an outstanding group of contributors was selected to author various chapters their collective achievements have included agency executive leadership university professorships and consultative activities at the state national and international levels each contributor as well has made significant scholarly contributions to the rehabilitation literature while the text was developed primarily for use in graduate rehabilitation counseling programs it has great utility for related academic programs in allied health psychology social sciences and special education the text also has practical value for in service and short term training anywhere that the vocational rehabilitation process can be facilitated from a client centered perspective

research in rehabilitation counseling provides the basics that one would need to begin conducting a research investigation it was written as a primary text for graduate level students and practitioners concerning the role of research in contemporary rehabilitation counseling it is the authors f intent to provide a comprehensive overview of the philosophical ethical methodological and analytic fundamentals of social science research as well as to specify aspects of rehabilitation research that distinguish it from scientific inquiry in other helping professions it has been thoroughly revised to accurately reflect the variation and wealth of research methodologies used in contemporary rehabilitation counseling research more than 300 new references have been added most of the research examples cited were published in peer reviewed rehabilitation counseling journals over the past decade and these examples represent the current status of research methods as well as the most relevant contemporary topic areas of research and scholarship in the field accordingly it may be used both as a research textbook and as a general introduction to the current scholarship because this book was written as an introductory research methods textbook for graduate students in rehabilitation counseling the authors focus much of the information contained herein on the role of readers as professional consumers of rehabilitation research it will prove to be an invaluable resource for counselors administrators policymakers educators researchers people with disabilities and consumer advocates

this state of the art textbook illustrates paradigms for professional practice provides an overview of current knowledge and future trends in rehabilitation counseling and aims to stimulate thinking that will lead to new research initiatives both settings private and public as well as services are addressed including placement advocacy and case management the text also contains elements of practice including cutting edge uses of technology and supervision both clinical and managerial the appendices include useful source materials such as rehabilitation acronyms and the code of professional ethics for certified rehabilitation counselors

theoretical underpinnings of social scientific inquiry provides a foundation in the philosophical epistemological and methodological considerations related to the design and execution of rehabilitation research and discusses the broad purposes of research chapter 2 addresses the issues that

the volume illustrates paradigms for professional practice and addresses important topics such as case and caseload management assessment quality assurance and the role of modern technology it includes such source material as the code of professional ethics for certified rehabilitation counselors and the commission on rehabilitation counseling certification crcc guidelines and procedures for processing complaints

emerging issues in rehabilitation counseling was written for use by practicing rehabilitation counselors administrators and educators chapter topics address new developments in the field of rehabilitation education and analysis of vocational rehabilitation with discussion on the order of selection mandate in the rehabilitation act life care planning is presented as an intervention for people with catastrophic disabilities client assessment strategies the americans with disabilities act job development and placement and provision of post employment services are offered as options to enable persons with disabilities to advance in their careers the authors examine the use of disability management programs to coordinate the interaction between worker and workplace to minimize the effect of the disability on a worker s capacity to function these programs include wellness programs safety awareness injury illness prevention training and employee assistance programs the final chapter addresses these and other challenges that vocational rehabilitation specialists will likely face in the future such as changes in occupational information disability management and managed care

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
