pilgrimage dorothy richardson s thirteen volume opus of autobiographical fiction follows the entire arc of an independent woman s life in early twentieth century britain it is one of the major works of the modernist period indeed it is considered by many a classic of modernist literature in this book joanne winning argues in this book however that richardson s novels continue to be misunderstood in several important ways winning is the first critic to fully explore the issues of lesbian identity in the novels examining primary materials manuscript drafts and richardson s previously unstudied correspondence winning demonstrates that *pilgrimage* contains a carefully constructed though concealed subtext of lesbian desire and sexuality the *pilgrimage* of dorothy richardson explores the ways in which richardson used such cultural forms as sexology psychoanalysis and other lesbian and modernist literature of her time to create an intertextual dialogue about lesbian identity winning suggests that a sustained reading of lesbian sexuality in *pilgrimage* is crucial to a more complete understanding of richardson s long and sometimes difficult work winning also places *pilgrimage* in the context of other works by female modernist writers that record lesbian identity this approach winning suggests is the first step toward recognizing and defining a literary movement that can be termed lesbian modernism as well as toward a deeper understanding of how lesbian modernist writers helped shape modernist literature as a whole

during the 1920s and 1930s willis richardson 1889 1977 was highly respected as a leading african american playwright and drama anthologist his plays were performed by numerous black high school college and university drama groups and by theater companies in chicago new york washington d c cleveland baltimore and atlanta with the opening of the chip woman s fortune 1923 he became the first african american to have a play produced on broadway several of his 46 plays were published in assorted magazines and in his essays he urged black americans to seek their dramatic material in their own lives and circumstances in addition he edited three anthologies of plays by african americans but between 1940 and his death in 1977 richardson came to realize that his plays were period pieces and that they no longer reflected the problems and situations of african americans in the years before his death he attempted vigorously yet unsuccessfully to preserve several of his plays through publication if not production but the man who has been called the father of african american drama and who was considered the hope and promise of african american drama died in obscurity richardson has even been neglected by the scholarly community this critical biography the first extensive consideration of his life and work firmly reestablishes his pioneering role in american theater the book begins with a detailed chronology followed by a thoughtful biographical essay the volume then examines the nature of african american drama in the 1920s the period during which richardson was most productive and it

analyzes his approach to drama as a means of educating african american audiences it then explores the african american community as the central theme in richardson s plays for richardson typically looks at the consequences of refusals by blacks to help one another the work additionally considers richardson s history plays his anthologies his dramas intended for black children and his essays a concluding chapter summarizes his lasting influence the book closes with a listing of his plays and an extensive bibliography

the author has talked to ralph richardson s colleagues and friends and from their memories and ralph s own words has produced a portrait of one of the greatest actors revealing the inner drive which took him to the heights of public acclaim

milton criticism often treats the poet as if he were the last of the renaissance poets or a visionary prophet who remained misunderstood until he was read by the romantics at the same time literary histories of the period often invoke a long eighteenth century that reaches its climax with the french revolution or the reform bill of 1832 what gets overlooked in such accounts is the rich story of milton s relationship to his contemporaries and early eighteenth century heirs the essays in this collection demonstrate that some of milton s earliest readers were more perceptive than romantic and twentieth century interpreters the translations editions and commentaries produced by early eighteenth century men of letters emerge as the seedbed of modern criticism and the term neoclassical is itself unmasked as an inadequate characterization of the literary criticism and poetry of the period a period that could brilliantly define a miltonic sublime even as it supported and described all the varieties of parody and domestication found in the mock epic and the novel these essays which are written by a team of leading miltonists and scholars of the restoration and eighteenth century cover a range of topics from milton s early editors and translators to his first theatrical producers from miltonic similes in pope s *iliad* to miltonic echoes in austen s *pride and prejudice* from marriage to slavery to republicanism to the heresy of arianism what they share in common is a conviction that the early eighteenth century understood milton and that the long restoration cannot be understood without him
