disliking people who came from cultures different from my own to loving them nonviolent theories and behavior were like a river flowing through my life slowly during my childhood and adolescence and rapidly after i enrolled in college the civil rights movement is the name of that river it was the foremost foundation upon which i built my philosophy of helping other people so of course the reverend dr martin luther king jr was my hero role model and guide his words and strategies of change are generously sprinkled throughout the later chapters of this book
