this illustrated primer on philosophy is a great way to be introduced to a complex topic in her easily accessible style margreet de heer visualizes the history of western philosophy and makes it approachable for those with little knowledge of the subject the book explains the thoughts of philosophers such as socrates plato aristotle descartes spinoza and nietzsche and ponders questions such as what is thinking what is reality is there free will and why are these ideas still important a perfect introduction to exploring philosophical concepts this humorous yet substantive graphic account strips the subject of unnecessary complexity

the author of the bestselling discovery in comics series including on science and philosophy tackles a very sensitive subject dealing with religion often means walking on eggshells that is what comic artist margreet de heer finds out when creating this book she presents the five major world religions and modern spirituality in a colourful personal yet serious manner she explores religious history and practices with tact and an open mind but can't prevent a few eggs from breaking this book in comics is fun and informative for both believers and non believers

in various scientific disciplines including math chemistry physics biology geology and quantum theory this work ponders questions such as who exclaimed eureka and why why did galileo get into a fight with the church and what happens when you have your dna tested this humorous yet substantive graphic account strips the subject of unnecessary complexity making it a perfect introduction to exploring scientific concepts

comics are a pervasive art form and an intrinsic part of the cultural fabric of most countries and yet relatively little has been written on the translation of comics comics in translation attempts to address this gap in the literature and to offer the first and most comprehensive account of various aspects of a diverse range of social practices subsumed under the label comics focusing on the role played by translation in shaping graphic narratives that appear in various formats different contributors examine various aspects of this popular phenomenon topics covered include the impact of globalization and localization processes on the ways in which translated comics are embedded in cultures the import of editorial and publishing practices textual strategies adopted in translating comics including the translation of culture and language specific features and the interplay between visual and verbal messages comics in translation examines comics that originate in different cultures belong to quite different genres and are aimed at readers of different age groups and cultural backgrounds from disney comics to art spiegelman s maus from katsuhiko Ōtomo s akira to goscinnny and uderzo s astérix the contributions are based on first hand research and exemplify a wide range of approaches languages covered include english italian spanish arabic french german japanese and inuit the volume features illustrations from the works discussed and an extensive annotated bibliography contributors include raffaella baccolini nadine celotti adele d arcangelo catherine delesse elena di giovanni heike elisabeth jüngerst valerio rota carmen valero garcés federico zanettin and jehan zitawi

whether one describes them as sequential art graphic narratives or graphic novels comics have become a vital part of contemporary culture their range of expression contains a tremendous variety of forms genres and modes from high to low from serial entertainment for children to complex works of art this has led to a growing interest in comics as a field of scholarly analysis as comics studies has established itself as a major branch of criticism this handbook combines a systematic survey of theories and concepts developed in the field alongside an overview of the most important contexts and themes and a wealth of close readings of seminal works and authors it will prove to be an indispensable handbook for a large readership ranging from researchers and instructors to students and anyone else with a general interest in this fascinating medium

this final work in john lent s series of bibliographies on comic art gathers together an astounding array of citations on american comic books and comic strips included in this volume are citations regarding anthologies and reprints criticism and reviews exhibitions festivals and awards scholarship and theory and the business artistic cultural legal technical and technological aspects of american comics author john lent has used all manner of methods to gather the citations searching library and online databases contacting scholars and other professionals attending conferences and festivals and scanning hundreds of periodicals he has gone to great length to categorize the citations in an easy to use scholarly fashion and in the process has helped to establish the field of comic art as an

important part of social science and humanities research the ten volumes in this series covering all regions of the world constitute the largest printed bibliography of comic art in the world and serve as the beacon guiding the burgeoning fields of animation comics and cartooning they are the definitive works on comic art research and are exhaustive in their inclusiveness covering all types of publications academic trade popular fan etc from all over the world also included in these books are citations to systematically researched academic exercises as well as more ephemeral sources such as fanzines press articles and fugitive materials conference papers unpublished documents etc attesting to lent s belief that all pieces of information are vital in a new field of study such as comic art

indie comic inclusion explores the profound impact of independent comics on lgbtq representation and social change moving beyond mainstream narratives the book showcases how indie comics have become a vital platform for marginalized voices offering nuanced portrayals of identity and challenging societal norms these comics provide a space where lgbtq artists and creators can authentically express themselves fostering a sense of community and driving social activism the book argues that indie comics have revolutionized visual storytelling by expanding the scope and depth of lgbtq representation the book begins by establishing the historical context of lgbtq representation in media and the rise of the independent comics scene it then delves into the diverse range of lgbtq identities depicted in indie comics examining how these narratives challenge traditional storytelling conventions through textual analysis interviews and historical data the book demonstrates how indie comics have fostered community building and activism ultimately indie comic inclusion emphasizes the importance of indie comics in promoting inclusivity and empowering marginalized voices within the broader media landscape

in 1931 the chicago tribune introduced the public to an exciting new comic strip destined to become a classic dick tracy tracy s creator chester gould would spend the next 46 years of his life developing the dynamic crime fighting character and his work on the strip won him the reuben award for outstanding cartoonist of the year in both 1959 and 1977 a revolutionary in the comics industry gould invented both a genre and an icon the personal story of this pioneer cartoonist is now presented in a biography written by gould s only child beginning with his young life in a three room house in pawnee oklahoma this book traces all the steps gould took to eventually achieve remarkable distinction at the top of his field the early pages relate his ancestors part in the oklahoma land rush drawing on the unpublished memoir of his father gilbert gould chester gould s story is then augmented by his own personal commentary taken directly from recorded conversations with his daughter throughout these conversations gould recollects the evolution of his career from painting advertisements on barn roofs at age 17 to documenting the violent crime life of chicago from which he drew inspiration for his dick tracy strip discussion of his ambitions disappointments popular accomplishments and family moments comprise a thorough account of chester gould s fascinating life appendices include commentary from his two grandchildren and a comprehensive list of his awards and distinctions which included formal recognition from three american presidents

an anthology of original short comics exploring the theme of discovery through diverse genres styles and perspectives this volume features ten unique stories by independent cartoonists each combining art and narrative to examine moments of transformation revelation and self awareness

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
