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weitere angaben inhalt boltanskis werk und sein umgang mit dem holocaust stellt eine herausforderung auch an disziplinen jenseits der kunstwissenschaft dar christian boltanski gehört zu den international renommiertesten gegenwartskünstlern sein künstlerischer umgang insbesondere mit der erinnerung an den holocaust hat diesen ruf weit über die kunstwelt hinaus begründet in einer geisteswissenschaftlichen forschungssituation in der erinnerungskulturen und phänomene des kulturellen gedächtnisses im zentrum des interesses stehen sind seine beiträge eine herausforderung auch für disziplinen jenseits der kunstwissenschaft das max planck institut für geschichte in göttingen hat christian boltanski eingeladen um an seinem werk leistungen und grenzen künstlerischer arbeit am kulturellen gedächtnis auszuloten im vergleich zur wissenschaftlichen arbeit an diesem gedächtnis christian boltanski hat eine arbeit beigetragen die hier erstmals publiziert wird sie bedient sich einzelner blätter aus der zeitschrift signal die von 1940 bis 1945 von der deutschen wehrmacht produziert und nur im ausland verkauft wurde das seinerzeit unter bild journalistischen gesichtspunkten bahnbrechende produkt wurde allein in den ersten drei jahren in mehr als hundert millionen exemplaren und bis zu zwanzig sprachen im ausland verkauft boltanski hat aus zwanzig heften des signal jeweils einen farbigen doppelaufschlag herausgenommen das zusammentreffen der auf der linken und der rechten seite des blattes gedruckten bilder ist zwar rein drucktechnisch bedingt aber doch zugleich die botschaft der zeitung stets stehen überlegene wehrtechnik und überlegene

this book is the first to explore in detail the encounter between albert flocon and gaston bachelard in postwar paris bachelard was a philosopher and historian of science who was also involved in literary studies and poetics flocon was a student of the bauhaus in dessau germany who specialized in copper engraving both deeply ingrained in the surrealist avant garde movements each acted at the frontiers of their respective métiers in exploring uncharted territory bachelard experienced the sciences of his time as constantly undergoing radical changes and he wanted to create a historical epistemology that would live up to this experience he saw the elementary gesture of the copper engraver the hand of the engraver as meeting the challenge of resistant and resilient matter in an exemplary fashion flocon was fascinated by bachelard s unconventional approach to the sciences and his poetics together their relationship interrogated and celebrated the interplay of hand and matter as it occurs in poetic writing in the art of engraving and in scientific experimentation in the form of a double biography hans jörg rheinberger succeeds in writing a lucid intellectual history and at the same time presents a fascinating illustrated reading of flocon's copper engravings

originally published in dutch and translated to spanish for the fourth centenary celebration of the death of el greco in 2014 this book is a comprehensive study of the rediscovery of el greco seen as one of the most important events of its kind in art history the nationalization of culture versus the rise of modern art analyses how changes in artistic taste in the second half of the nineteenth century caused a profound revision of the place of el greco in the artistic canon as a result el greco was transformed from an extravagant outsider and a secondary painter into the founder of the spanish school and one of the principle predecessors of modern art increasingly related to that of the impressionists due primarily to the german critic julius meier graefe's influential history of modern art 1914 this shift in artistic preference has been attributed to the rise of modern art but eric storm a cultural historian shows that in the case of el greco nationalist motives were even more important this study examines the work of painters art critics writers scholars and philosophers from france germany and spain and the role of exhibitions auctions monuments and commemorations paintings and associated anecdotes are discussed and historical debates such as el greco's supposed astigmatism are addressed in a highly readable and engaging style this book will be of interest to both specialists and the interested art public

this volume explores the mutual influences between children's literature and the avant garde olson places particular focus on fin de siècle paris where the avant garde was not unified in thought and there was room for modernism to overlap with children's literature and culture in the golden age the ideas explored by artists such as florence upton henri rousseau sir william nicholson paula modersohn becker and marc chagall had been disseminated widely in cultural productions for children their work in turn influenced children's culture these artists turned to children's culture as a new way of seeing allied to a contemporary interest in international artistic styles children's culture also has strong ties to decadence and to the grotesque the latter of which became a distinctively modernist vision this book visits the qualities of the era that were defined as uniquely childlike the relation of childhood to high and low art and the relation of children's literature to fin de siècle artistic trends topics of interest include the use of non european figures the golliwogg approaches to religion and pedagogy to oppression and motherhood to nature in a post darwinian world and to vision in art and life olson's unique focus covers new ground by concentrating not simply on children's literature but on how childhood experiences and culture figure in art

the first comprehensive history in english of film at the bauhaus exploring practices that experimented with film as an adaptable elastic polymedium with design in motion laura frahm proposes an alternate history of the bauhaus one in which visual media and film in particular are crucial to the bauhaus s visionary pursuit of integrating art and technology in the first comprehensive examination in english of film at the bauhaus frahm shows that experimentation with film spanned a range of bauhaus practices from textiles and typography to stage and exhibition design indeed bauhausler deployed film as an adaptable elastic polymedium malleable in shape and form unfolding and refracting into multiple material aesthetic and philosophical directions frahm shows how the encounter with film imbued the bauhaus of the 1920s and early 1930s with a flexible notion of design infusing painting with temporal concepts sculptures with moving forms photographs with sequential aesthetics architectural designs with a choreography of movement frahm considers among other things student works that explored light and the transparent features of celluloid and cellophane weaving practices that incorporate cellophane experimental films social documentaries and critical reportage by bauhaus women and the proliferation of film strips in posters book covers and other typographic work viewing the bauhaus s engagement with film through a media theoretic lens frahm shows how film became a medium for design in motion movement and process rather than stability and fixity become the defining characteristics of bauhaus educational aesthetic and philosophical ethos

a beautifully illustrated examination of the women artists whose inspired search for artistic integrity and equality influenced expressionist avant garde culture women artists in expressionism explores how women negotiated the competitive world of modern art during the late wilhelmine and early weimar periods in germany their stories challenge predominantly male oriented narratives of expressionism and shed light on the divergent artistic responses of women to the dramatic events of the early twentieth century shulamith behr shows how the posthumous critical reception of paula modersohn becker cast her as a prime agent of the feminization of the movement and how käthe kollwitz used printmaking as a vehicle for technical innovation and sociopolitical commentary she looks at the dynamic relationship between marianne werefkin and gabriele münter whose different paths in life led them to the blaue reiter a group of expressionist artists that

included wassily kandinsky and paul klee behr examines nell walden s role as an influential art dealer collector and artist who promoted women expressionists during the first world war and discusses how dutch artist jacoba van heemskerck s spiritual abstraction earned her the status of an honorary german expressionist she demonstrates how figures such as rosa schapire and johanna ey contributed to the development of the movement as spectators critics and collectors of male avant gardism richly illustrated women artists in expressionism is a women centered history that reveals the importance of emancipative ideals to the shaping of modernity and the avant garde

this publication is the first to examine the enormous influence of van gogh on german and austrian expressionism it presents numerous masterpieces by van gogh and the expressionists including extremely powerful works by the painters of die brucke der blaue reiter and the viennese avant garde book jacket

framed by evocative inscriptions tumultuous historical events and the ambiguities of christian death romanesque tomb effigies were the first large scale figural monuments for the departed in european art in this book shirin fozi explores these provocative markers of life and death establishing early tomb figures as a coherent genre that hinged upon histories of failure and frustrated ambition in sharp contrast to later recumbent funerary figures none of the known european tomb effigies made before circa 1180 were commissioned by the people they represented and all of the identifiable examples of these tombs were dedicated to individuals whose legacies were fraught rather than triumphant fozi draws on this evidence to argue that romanesque effigies were created to address social rather than individual anxieties they compensated for defeat by converting local losses into an expectation of eternal victory comforting the embarrassed heirs of those whose histories were marked by misfortune and offering compensation for the disappointments of the world featuring numerous examples and engaging the visual historical and theological contexts that inform them this groundbreaking work adds a fresh dimension to the study of monumental sculpture and the idea of the individual in the northern european middle ages it will appeal to scholars of art history and medieval studies

yes no perhaps are the most written words in mary bauermeister's artworks together they stand for the concept of many valued aesthetics in the german artist's oeuvre an aesthetic that bauermeister developed using many valued logic hauke ohls brings the artist's central groups of works in context with each other as well as with the neo avant garde of the post war period in europe and the usa he shows that the development of bauermeister's art may appear disparate but her canvas and relief works drawings and writing pictures lens boxes and stone pictures are characterized by a reciprocal relationship of combinations and interconnections through the ubiquitous use of meta references the entire oeuvre ultimately appears as an interconnected assemblage

one of the most admired artists of the twentieth century max ernst was a proponent of dada and founder of surrealism known for his strange evocative paintings and drawings in prehistoric future ralph ubl approaches ernst like no one else has using theories of the unconscious surrealist automatism freudian psychoanalysis the concept of history as trauma to examine how ernst s construction of collage departs from other modern artists ubl shows that while picasso braque and man ray used scissors and glue to create collages ernst employed techniques he himself had forged rubbing and scraping to bring images forth onto a sheet of paper or canvas to simulate how a screen image or memory comes into the mind s view in addition ernst scoured the past for obsolete scientific illustrations and odd advertisements to illustrate the rapidity with which time passes and to simulate the apprehension generated when rapid flows of knowledge turn living culture into artifact ultimately ubl reveals ernst was interested in the construction and phenomenology of both collective and individual modern history and memory shedding new light on ernst s working methods and the reasons that his pieces continue to imprint themselves in viewers memories prehistoric future is an innovative work of critical writing on a key figure of surrealism

text in english and german the oeuvre of stefan wewerka occupies a unique position in post war art because of the way in which he mixes different genres wewerka is an uomo universale an uncomfortable pedagogue a bringer of enlightenment in addition to his practical work as an architect his competition entries

have had a lasting effect on architectural discourse he has alienated architecture photographically or with the aid of traditional artistic techniques has written books has painted pictures has made films and object art in the early 50s wewerka involved himself in earth architecture early attempts to build with nature and not against it and this at a time when no one was talking about ecology or even green building wewerka became known to a wider public in the 60s by the artistic allenation of chairs and other everyday objects which he sawed up or distorted in order to undermine familiar images subversively he also did not leave architectural high culture untouched triumphal arches like the arc de triomphe in paris or gothic cathedrals heel over or buckle to form surreal structures and thus make their ideological claims questionable in the late 70s wewerka also started to design furniture which had high utility value despite its free form and which emanate an almost bauhaus like dignity all this furniture like the fan desk the three legged chair or the one swinger and also his kitchen tree and the programmatic cella furniture system stand like sculptures in the space and always derive a new and surprising variant from subjects and genres that seemed to be closed the internationally known architecture and design historian volker fischer was vice director of the deutsches architekturmuseum in frankfurt for over 10 years for some time now he has been building up a new design department in the museum fur kunsthandwerk in frankfurt in addition to his museum work he teaches history of architecture and design at the hochschule fur gestaltung in offenbach like volker fischer architectural historian andrea gleiniger worked for many years in the deutsches architekturmuseum in frankfurt she now teaches at the staatliche hochschule fur gestaltung in karisruhe her principal working fields are the history of housing estates in the 20th century and the relationship between architecture art and the new media
