this illustrated survey of 600 years of fashion investigates its cultural and social meaning from medieval europe to twentieth century america breward s work provides the reader with a clear guide to the changes in style and taste and shows that clothes have always played a pivotal role in defining a sense of identity and society especially when concerned with sexual and body politics

newly avilable in paperback this major contribution to cultural history is a study of dress in france in the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries daniel roche discusses general approaches to the history of dress locates the subject within current french historiography and uses a large sample of inventories to explore the differences between the various social classes in the amount they spent and the kind of clothes they wore his essential argument is that there was a vestimentary revolution in the later eighteenth century as all sections of the population became caught up in the world of fashion and fast moving consumption

throughout history certain forms and styles of dress have been deemed appropriate or

more significantly inappropriate for people as they age older women in particular have long been subject to social pressure to tone down to adopt self effacing covered up styles but increasingly there are signs of change as older women aspire to younger more mainstream styles and retailers realize the potential of the grey market fashion and age is the first study to systematically explore the links between clothing and age drawing on fashion theory and cultural gerontology to examine the changing ways in which age is imagined experienced and understood in modern culture through the medium of dress clothes lie between the body and its social expression and the book explores the significance of embodiment in dress and in the cultural constitution of age drawing on the views of older women journalists and fashion editors and clothing designers and retailers it aims to widen the agenda of fashion studies to encompass the everyday dress of the majority shifting the debate about age away from its current preoccupation with dependency towards a fuller account of the lived experience of age fashion and age will be of great interest to students of fashion material culture sociology sociology of age history of dress and to clothing designers

technology has been an essential factor in the production of dress and the cultures of fashion throughout human history structured chronologically from prehistory to the present day this is the first broad study of the complex relationship between dress and technology over the course of human history dress making and fashion technology has changed beyond recognition from needles and human hands in the ancient world to complex 20th century textile production machines it has now come to include the technologies that influence dress styles and the fashion industry while fashion itself may drive aspects of technology in the last century new technologies such as the electronic media and high tech manufacturing have helped not just to produce but to define fashion the creation of automobiles prompted a decline in long skirts for women while the beginnings of space travel caused people to radically rethink the function of dress in many ways technology has itself created avant garde and contemporary fashions through an impressive range of international case studies the book challenges the perception that fashion is unique to western dress and outlines the many ways in which dress and technology intersect dress fashion and technology is ideal reading for students and scholars of fashion studies textile history anthropology and cultural studies

a dress also known as a frock or a gown is a garment traditionally worn by women or girls consisting of a skirt with an attached bodice or a matching bodice giving the effect of a one piece garment it consists of a top piece that covers the torso and hangs down over the legs a dress can be any one piece garment containing a skirt of any length and can be formal or casual a dress can have sleeves straps or be held up with elastic around the chest leaving the shoulders bare dresses also vary in color the hemlines of dresses vary depending on modesty weather fashion or the personal taste of the wearer dresses are outer garments made up of a bodice and a skirt and can be made in one or more pieces dresses are generally suitable for both formal wear and casual wear in the west for women and girls historically dresses could also include other items of clothing such as corsets kirtles partlets petticoats smocks and stomachers

asian fashion has become a global phenomenon of significant economic political and social import but the industry in asia remains characterized by the gap between

traditional centres of fashion and power and the relatively marginalized periphery that includes asia the resulting fashions are ambiguous despite their indigenous origins and inspiration their survival depends upon the west this book explores asian fashion in a global economic and cultural context in itself this is pathbreaking because fashion studies have traditionally divided along the boundaries of the western non western dichotomy when both production and consumption cut through these traditional boundaries new fashion principles are expressed globally how are western economic cultural political iconic and social forms inscribed in indigenous asian fashion when and often because that fashion is an expression of resistance against western encroachment how does dress become an active site for the negotiation of state ideals and gender roles in nations struggling to construct new identities informed by modern western impulses what role does gender play in negotiating dress symbols and how does this tie in with commodification by the global economic system with chapters focusing on east south and southeast asian designers retailers consumers and governments this book moves asian fashion centre stage and should be of interest to dress and fashion theorists anthropologists sociologists and all those seeking to understand globalization and its effects

the clothes worn by our ancestors afford an unparalleled insight into lifestyles that have disappeared forever choice of dress has always been governed by a series of influences social and economic artistic and technical and of course the vagaries of individual taste jane ashelford has used the national trust s stunning costume and textile collections as well as its historic house portraits family correspondence diaries and household papers to produce a fascinating account of the history of dress over the past four centuries

the fashioned body provides a wide ranging and original overview of fashion and dress from an historical and sociological perspective the book gives a clear summary of the theories surrounding the role and function of fashion in modern society and examines how fashion plays a crucial role in the formation of modern identity through its articulation of the body gender and sexuality in examining fashion in relation to the body the book offers a much needed synthesis between the literature on fashion and dress which has tended to ignore the body and the sociology of the body which has tended to marginalize fashion and dress entwistle shows how an understanding of fashion and dress requires an understanding of the meanings acquired by the body in culture since it is the body that fashion speaks to and which is dressed in almost all social situations and encounters she argues that while fashion refers to a specific system of dress originating in the west all cultures dress the body in the same way making it a crucial feature of social order drawing on the work of douglas foucault merleau ponty goffman and bourdieu the book offers insights into the connections that need to be made between the body fashion and dress arguing for an account of fashion and dress as situated bodily practice the fashioned body will be an invaluable resource for students and academics interested in the social role of fashion and dress in modern culture and will also be of interest to students and researchers in the areas of consumption cultural studies gender studies and feminist theory
