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test based psychological assessment has been significantly affected by the health care revolution in the united states during the past two decades despite new limitations on psychological services across the board and psychological testing in particular it continues to offer a rapid and efficient method of identifying problems planning and monitoring a course of treatment and assessing the outcomes of interventions this thoroughly revised and greatly expanded third edition of a classic reference now three volumes constitutes an invaluable resource for practitioners who in a managed care era need to focus their testing not on the general goals of personality assessment symptom identification and diagnosis so often presented to them as students and trainees but on specific questions what course of treatment should this person receive how is it going was it effective new chapters describe new tests and models and new concerns such as ethical aspects of outcomes assessment volume i reviews general issues and recommendations concerning the use of psychological testing for screening for psychological disturbances planning and monitoring appropriate interventions and the assessing outcomes and offers specific guidelines for selecting instruments it also considers more specific issues such as the analysis of group and individual patient data the selection and implementation of outcomes instrumentation and the ethics of gathering and using outcomes data volume ii discusses psychological measures developed for use with younger children and adolescents that can be used for the purposes outlined in volume i volume iii those developed for use with adults drawing on the knowledge and experience of a diverse group of leading experts test developers researchers clinicians and others the third edition of the use of psychological testing for treatment planning and outcomes assessment provides vital assistance to all clinicians and to their trainees and graduate students

this text is a vital resource for those with little or no prior knowledge of computing or statistics to aid in the development of reliable and valid tests and scales for assessment or research purposes it serves as a clear concise and jargon free primer for all those embarking in fieldwork or research analysis the book contains detailed guidelines for locating and constructing psychological measures including descriptions of popular psychological measures and step by step instructions for composing a measure entering data and computing reliability and validity of test results advanced techniques such as factor analysis analysis of covariance and multiple regression analysis are presented for the beginner this new edition has been revised throughout and includes updated statistical test procedures in line with the new version of spss and the inclusion of current academic articles it serves as an invaluable resource for undergraduates and postgraduates across the behavioral and social sciences as well as professionals in related disciplines including those working in management and medical sciences

this book is an introductory text to the field of psychological testing primarily suitable for undergraduate students in psychology education business and related fields this book will also be of interest to graduate students who have not had a prior exposure to psychological testing and to professionals such as lawyers who need to consult a useful source psychological testing is clearly written well organized comprehensive and replete with illustrative materials in addition to the basic topics the text

covers in detail topics that are often neglected by other texts such as cross cultural testing the issue of faking tests the impact of computers and the use of tests to assess positive behaviors such as creativity

in the traditional medical setting clinical psychology and psychiatry have operated independently but clinicians now recognise that psychologists and psychiatrists working together can maximise the effectiveness of treatment and improve quality of life for individuals and families up to 25 of medical patients present with significant psychological problems and unless practice is integrated these problems often remain untreated an integrated practice and training allows clinicians to recognise and treat psychological problems thereby reducing the economic and social costs associated with such illness in addition the input of psychology and psychiatry is now understood to have a role in disease progress and medical management as well as in prevention and health promotion compares the disciplines of clinical psychology and psychiatry and their practice in medical environments provides a how to and what to expect for clinicians who use the services of psychologists and psychiatrists forecasts the development and growth of this approach in medical social and policy contexts offers professional development guidance to psychologists and psychiatrists working outside the medical arena

this accessible and engaging book for undergraduates is less cluttered with details than other books for the course and students like to read it it offers an up to date analysis of the most widely used tests in educational industrial clinical and health settings the third edition features a significant increase in the number of test profiles sample items and figures while it addresses timely and controversial topics such as nationalized testing test bias and cross cultural issues kaplan and saccuzzo cover the technical principles of test evaluation and construction in a concise comprehensible manner using practical examples from real life assuming no theoretical background and little knowledge of statistics the book provides thorough coverage of basic statistical concepts while ensuring an understanding of important principles

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
