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the single sword is the most used weapon on both stage and screen the techniques used in single sword stage combat are derived from real combative methods used historically and modified for acting basics of stage combat single sword instructs the reader about the foundations of safe skillful single sword use in theater film and television actors both wishing to refresh their old skills and those new to stage combat will learn how to parry with a sword move with a sword and perfect the various movements required of them to perform a safe and realistic stage combat scene

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basics of stage combat single sword will also help drama students who are taking stage combat classes or stage combat exams gain the confidence to embrace the complexities of working with a sword among the swords discussed are the single rapier sabre and the eighteenth century small sword this book does not discuss broadsword techniques chapters provide illustration and instruction about thrusts lunges hand positions advancing and retreating passing steps binds beats and cutting with the sword as well as basic fighting positions a brief fight choreography sequence is included at the conclusion of the book

the second in dwight mclemore s fighting weapons series the fighting sword began as a way for the author to chronicle his experience of commissioning a custom made sword and then designing a training program to use with it as he developed the sword fighting concepts techniques and combat scenarios for use with his sword however he realized that they could be adapted and used by anyone with a sword mclemore brings the fighting sword to life with his unique style of dynamic drawing seen also in his books on the bowie knife and in the fighting tomahawk first he gives a crash course in how to balance form and function in a sword and then focuses on tactical techniques and concepts he teaches you how to train for a confrontation by using visualization and training partners as well as how to instantly and accurately evaluate an opponent his weapon the terrain and environment and your advantages or disadvantages in various combat scenarios following his precise instructions and skillfully rendered illustrations you will learn how to master cuts thrusts blocks and parries which you can then use for the more advanced techniques of disruption working the inner circle and single hand use when it comes to fighting weapons there is no better instructor than dwight mclemore

in the 17th century italy was the place to learn the art of the sword travellers visited training salles and across europe italian works on fencing were translated and italian schools sprang up france was no exception francois dancie s 1623 treatise *l espee de combat* the sword of combat is therefore an anomaly dancie s views are blunt and acidic he says that many who teach fencing are a bunch of libertines he has no truck with the geometry that had crept into fencing since agrippa s work of 1553 and had contempt for that author s use of illustration dancie s style follows an italian form but rather than following other authors by providing an explanation of tempo and measure dancie prefers to concentrate on what temperament is required in a confrontation his is a direct fighter s treatise dedicated to a military man of similar temperament his

methods and descriptions speak more of the street than the salle

if you are looking for an instructional manual full of step by step illustrations for learning japanese and european swordsmanship do not buy this book this book does not tell you everything you need to know about specific techniques and does not contain hundreds of pictures detailing each step involved in attacking and defending with the sword nor is it a suitable reference manual for arms collectors like my previous books on edged weaponry the focus is critical thinking through historical analysis our purpose is to pit a samurai against a medieval knight to determine who proved to be the better swordsman who wielded the better sword and who came from the superior culture our analysis will encourage you to think about the many nuances of swordsmanship in different terrains and cultural settings and how a japanese samurai might have acted and reacted had he crossed swords with a european medieval knight and vice versa it is of interest to those who have some experience practicing with the sword but primarily to those who like to ponder the use of the sword in a historical context neither for sports or to settle points of honor nor for health or personal fulfillment but on the battlefield where the objective was to kill the opponent the intent is to discern relationships between seemingly separate histories and lead us toward a broader horizon regarding historical swordsmanship to reach our objective we will discuss practical sword designs and their purposes sword dynamics and the principles of physics and common tactics of offense and defense as we proceed consider that in martial arts as practiced today many combat techniques and forms are overly ritualized and complex in sword combat to the death by contrast the straightest and fewest moves possible were used to reach the objective the tactics that the samurai and medieval knight chose were not about looking and feeling good but about getting it done they picked up the sword in defense of their king master or country and were prepared to fight to the death

this sixteenth century german guide to sword fighting and combat training is a crucial source for understanding medieval swordplay techniques following his translation of joachim meyer s the art of combat jeffrey l forgeng was alerted to an earlier version of meyer s text discovered in lund university library in sweden the manuscript produced in strasbourg around 1568 is illustrated with thirty watercolor images and seven ink diagrams the text covers combat with the longsword hand and a half sword dusack a one handed practice weapon comparable to a sabre and rapier the manuscript s

theoretical discussion of guards sheds significant light on this key feature of the historical practice not just in relation to meyer but in relation to medieval combat systems in general the art of sword combat also offers an extensive repertoire of training drills for both the dusack and the rapier a feature largely lacking in treatises of the period and critical to modern reconstructions of the practice forgeng s translation also includes a biography of meyer much of which has only recently come to light as well as technical terminology and other essential information for understanding and contextualizing the work
