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nei casermoni di via stalingrado a piombino avere quattordici anni è difficile e se tuo padre è un buono a nulla o si spezza la schiena nelle acciaierie che danno pane e disperazione a mezza città il massimo che puoi desiderare è una serata al pattinodromo o avere un fratello che comandi il branco o trovare il tuo nome scritto su una panchina lo sanno bene anna e francesca amiche inseparabili che tra quelle case popolari si sono trovate e scelte quando il corpo adolescente inizia a cambiare a esplodere sotto i vestiti in un posto così non hai alternative o ti nascondi e resti tagliata fuori oppure sbatti in faccia agli altri la tua bellezza la usi con violenza e speri che ti aiuti a essere qualcuno loro ci provano convinte che per sopravvivere basti lottare ma la vita è feroce e non si piega scorre immobile senza vie d uscita poi un giorno arriva l amore però arriva male le poche certezze vanno in frantumi e anche l amicizia invincibile tra anna e francesca si incrina sanguina comincia a far male attraverso gli occhi di due ragazzine che diventano grandi silvia avallone ci racconta un italia in cerca d identità e di voce apre uno squarcio su un

inedita periferia operaia nel tempo in cui si dice la classe operaia non esiste più e lo fa con un romanzo potente che sorprende e non si dimentica

this volume proposes a rich corpus of papers about the other city a subject only few times dealt with but worthy of all our attention it imposes itself on the scene of international modern and contemporary historiography for its undeniable topicality throughout history the city has always had to deal with social otherness i.e. with class privileges and consequently with discrimination and marginalization of minorities of the less well off of foreigners in short with the differences in status culture religion so that the urban fabric has ended up structuring itself also in function of those inequalities as well as of the strategic places for the exercise of power of the political military or social control of the spaces for imprisonment for the sanitary isolation or for the temporary remedy to the catastrophes from the first portraits of cities made and diffused at the beginning of the fifteenth century for political exaltation purposes or for religious propaganda and for devotional purposes which often through increasingly refined graphic techniques distort or even deny the true urban image we reach at the dawn of contemporary history the new meaning given by scientific topography and new methods of representation these latter aimed at revealing the structure and the urban landscape in their objectivity often unexpected for who had known the city through the filter of regime iconography the representation of the urban image still shows the contradictions of a community that sometimes includes and even exalts the diversities other times rejects them showing the unease of a difficult integration

over the past century the italian landscape has undergone exceedingly rapid transformations shifting from a mostly rural environment to a decidedly modern world this changing landscape is endowed with a narrative agency that transforms how we understand our surroundings situated at the juncture of italian studies and ecocriticism and following the recent material turn in the environmental humanities elemental narratives outlines an original cultural and environmental map of the bel paese giving equal weight to readings of fiction nonfiction works of visual art and physical sites enrico cesaretti investigates the interconnected stories emerging from both human creativity and the expressive eloquence of global materials such as sulfur petroleum marble steel and asbestos that have helped make and simultaneously unmake today's Italy affecting its socio environmental health in multiple ways embracing the idea of a decentralized agency that is shared among human and nonhuman entities cesaretti suggests that engaging with these entangled discursive and material texts is a sound and revealing ecocritical practice that promises to generate new knowledge and more participatory affective responses to

environmental issues both in Italy and elsewhere ultimately he argues that complementing quantitative data based information with insights from fiction and nonfiction the arts and other humanistic disciplines is both desirable and crucial if we want to modify perceptions and attitudes increase our awareness and understanding and in turn develop more sustainable worldviews in the era of the anthropocene elegantly written and convincingly argued this book will appeal broadly to scholars and students working in the fields of environmental studies comparative literatures ecocriticism environmental history and Italian studies

this book explores the formal and thematic conventions of crime film the contexts in which these have flourished and their links with the social issues of a globalized world the crime film has traditionally been identified with suspense a heterogeneous aesthetic and a tacit social mind however a good number of the crime films produced since the early 2000s have shifted their focus from action or suspense and towards melodrama in narratives that highlight the social dimension of crime intensify their realist aesthetics and dwell on subjectivity with the 1940s wave of Hollywood semi documentary crime films and 1970s generic revisionism as antecedents these crime films find inspiration in Hollywood cinema and constitute a transnational trend with a close look at Steven Soderbergh's *Traffic* 2000 David Fincher's *Zodiac* 2007 Jacques Audiard's *Un prophète* 2009 and Tomas Alfredson's *Tinker Tailor Soldier Spy* 2011 this book sets out the stylistic and thematic conventions contexts and cultural significance of a new transnational trend in crime film

includere altre commistioni dalle dinamiche ibridative che costituiscono la vita degli organismi nell'ambiente alle analisi in cui i piani linguistici e discorsivi si confondono con pratiche di mistificazione ecco dunque tracciate le coordinate di questo libro in cui autori e autrici diversi per esperienze e professionalità dialogano sulle confluenze di cibo ambiente e testi culturali contribuendo al dibattito transdisciplinare delle *environmental humanities*

in *Toxic Matters* Monica Seger considers two Italian environmental disasters an isolated factory explosion in Seveso just north of Milan in 1976 and the ongoing daily toxic emissions from the Ilva steelworks in the Apulian city of Taranto both have exposed residents to high concentrations of the persistent organic pollutant known as dioxin although different in terms of geography and temporality Seveso and Taranto are deeply united by this nearly imperceptible substance and by the representational complexities it poses they are also united by creative narrative expressions in literary cinematic and other forms that push back against dominant contexts and representations perpetuated by state and industrial actors Seger traces a dialogue between Seveso and Taranto exploring an interplay between bodies soil industrial emissions and the wealth of dynamic particulate matter that passes in between at the same time she emphasizes the crucial function of narrative expression for making sense of this modern day reality and for shifting existing power dynamics as exposed communities exercise their voices while *Toxic Matters* is grounded in Italian cases and texts it looks outward to the pressing questions of toxicity embodiment and storytelling faced by communities worldwide

a sensually charged novel about two girls growing up fast in a failing industrial town on the coast of italy anna and francesca are on the brink of everything high school adulthood and the edge of ambition in their provincial town it's summer in piombino italy and in their skimpy bathing suits flaunting their newly acquired curves the girls suddenly have everyone in their thrall this power opens their imagination to a destiny beyond piombino the resort town of elba is just a ferry ride away and yet they've never dared to go maybe the future is waiting for them there or somewhere beyond when their friendship suffers a blow the girls set off on their own only to discover that their budding sexuality takes them further than they expect though not as far as their dreams as their choices take

them to a painful crossroads the girls must reconnect if they have any hope of escaping their small town destinies in this poetic prizewinning debut silvia avallone captures the lost innocence of a generation harrowing yet ultimately redemptive swimming to elba is a story about the power of friendship and the way that family friendship and economics shape our world

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
