preserved on a single surviving manuscript dating from around 1400 composed by an anonymous master sir gawain and the green knight was rediscovered only 200 years ago and published for the first time in 1839 one of the earliest great stories of english literature after beowulf the poem narrates in crystalline verse the strange tale of a green knight on a green horse who rudely interrupts the round table festivities one yuletide casting a pall of unease over the company and challenging one of their number to a wager the virtuous gawain accepts and decapitates the intruder with his own axe gushing blood the knight reclaims his head orders gawain to seek him out a year hence and departs next yuletide gawain dutifully sets forth his quest for the green knight involves a winter journey a seduction scene in a dream like castle a dire

challenge answered and a drama of enigmatic reward disguised as psychic undoing simon armitage s new version is meticulously responsible to the tact and sophistication of the original but responsible equally to its own powerfully persuasive claims to be read as an original new poem it is as if six hundred years apart two northern poets set out on a journey through the same mesmeric landscapes acoustic physical and metaphorical in the course of which the gawain poet has finally found his true and long awaited translator

the alliterative morte arthure the title given to a four thousand line poem written sometime around 1400 was part of a medieval arthurian revival which produced such masterpieces as sir gawain and the green knight and sir thomas malory's prose morte d arthur like gawain the alliterative morte arthure is a unique manuscript held in the library of lincoln cathedral by an anonymous author and written in alliterating lines which harked back to anglo saxon poetic composition unlike gawain whose plot hinges around one moment of jaw dropping magic the death of king arthur deals in the cut and thrust of warfare and politics the ever topical matter of britain's relationship with continental europe and of its military interests overseas simon armitage is already the master of this alliterative music as his earlier version of sir gawain and the green knight 2006 so resourcefully and exuberantly showed his new translation restores a neglected masterpiece of story telling by bringing vividly to life its entirely medieval mix of ruthlessness and restraint
