for fans of unheralded women s stories a captivating look at sigrid schultz one of the earliest reporters to warn americans of the rising threat of the nazi regime no other american correspondent in berlin knew so much of what was going on behind the scene as did sigrid schultz william l shirer author of the rise and fall of the third reich we are facing an alarming upsurge in the spread of misinformation and attempts by powerful figures to discredit facts so they can seize control of narratives these are threats american journalist sigrid schultz knew all too well the chicago tribune s berlin bureau chief and primary foreign correspondent for central europe from 1925 to january 1941 schultz witnessed hitler s rise to power and was one of the first reporters male or female to warn american readers of the growing dangers of nazism in the dragon from chicago pamela d toler draws on extensive archival research to unearth the largely forgotten story of schultz s years spent courageously reporting the news from berlin from the revolts of 1919 through the nazi rise to power and allied air raids over berlin in 1941 at a time when women reporters rarely wrote front page stories and her male colleagues saw a powerful unmarried woman as a freak schultz pulled back the curtain on how the nazis misreported the news to their own people and how they attempted to control the foreign press through bribery and threats sharp and enlightening schultz s story provides a powerful example for how we can reclaim truth in an era marked by the spread of disinformation and claims of fake news

charles hodge 1797 1878 was one of nineteenth century america s leading theologians owing in part to a lengthy teaching career voluminous writings and a faculty post at one of the nation s most influential schools princeton theological seminary surprisingly the only biography of this towering figure was written by his son just two years after his death paul c gutjahr s book is the first modern critical biography of a man some have called the pope of presbyterianism hodge s legacy is especially important to american presbyterians his brand of theological conservatism became vital in the 1920s as princeton seminary saw itself and its denomination split the conservative wing held unswervingly to the old school tradition championed by hodge and ultimately founded the breakaway orthodox presbyterian church the views that hodge developed refined and propagated helped shape many of the central traditions of twentieth and twenty first century american evangelicalism hodge helped establish a profound reliance on the bible among evangelicals and he became one of the nation s most vocal proponents of biblical inerrancy gutjahr s study reveals the exceptional depth breadth and longevity of hodge s theological influence and illuminates the varied and complex nature of conservative american protestantism

between 1931 and 1939 central athens was transformed by the expropriation and

demolition of the vrysaki neighborhood at the foot of the acropolis in these few years more than 5 000 inhabitants were displaced and 348 properties were torn down so that the american school of classical studies at athens ascsa could excavate the ancient agora the scale of the project and the degree to which it was documented make this a unique episode in the history of greek archaeology using materials from the ascsa archives and a large collection of photographs from the 1930s this volume details the history of the negotiations the expropriations and most importantly the vrysaki neighborhood itself illustrating its streets shops houses names and faces the author provides a vivid recreation of the community that was vrysaki

from popular front to cold war tells the story of the international workers order iwo an organization founded in 1930 to provide life burial and health insurance to its members but as the essays gathered by elissa sampson and robert m zecker make clear the iwo broadened its mission to promote interracial solidarity support labor unions combat racism and antisemitism and champion progressive social programs from the great depression into the postwar era at its height the iwo had almost two hundred thousand members drawn from a broad ethnic and racial spectrum of the working class jews blacks poles slovaks italians hispanics and others it operated summer camps published foreign language newspapers and supported a wide range of cultural activities an early advocate for the united states entry into world war ii the iwo was also ahead of its time in championing the nascent civil rights movement after the war it was declared a subversive organization due to its ties to the communist party and disbanded in 1954 though its legacy as a model for working class cooperation across racial and ethnic differences endures to this day contributors felicia bevel paul buhle matthew calhman annabel gottfried cohen dylan kaufman obstler paul c mishler ben ratskoff elissa sampson henry srebrnik lauren b strauss nerina visacovsky jennifer young robert m zecker

in the late 1930s a number of american women especially those allied with various peace and isolationist groups protested against the nation s entry into world war ii while their story is fairly well known margaret paton walsh reveals a far less familiar story of women who fervently felt that american intervention was absolutely necessary paton walsh recounts how the united states became involved in the war but does so through the eyes of american women who faced it as a necessary evil covering the period between 1935 and 1941 she examines how these women functioned as political actors even though they were excluded from positions of power through activism in women s organizations informal women s networks and even male dominated lobbying groups in the great debate over whether america should enter the war some women favored aid to the allies not because they hoped for war but because they hoped aid would forestall more direct u s involvement but also because they believed war was preferable to a nazi victory paton walsh shows that this activism involved some of the most prominent women of their day elizabeth cutter morrow whose son in law charles lindbergh was an isolationist spokesman supported the revision of the neutrality acts to allow the sale of arms to the allies and expressed her support in a national radio broadcast soon other women joined this debate esther brunauer of the aauw journalist dorothy thompson and organizations like the league of women voters and national women s trade union league broke from the pacifist tradition to advocate american aid for the allied cause focusing on the conflict in europe paton walsh shows how these women grasped the implications of the lend lease program for america s entry into the war but supported it nevertheless by late 1941 the women s division of the fight for freedom committee had been established no longer merely advocating aid to britain to keep american boys out of battle this organization supported direct american involvement in the war as a means of stopping nazi oppression while most historians have focused on women s pacifism paton walsh connects women more directly to world events and shows how those interventionists reformulated maternalist ideas to justify and explain their beliefs our war too is a story of american women trying to reconcile the irreconcilable to preserve both their principles and their peace it expands our understanding of women as political actors and thinkers about foreign policy as it sheds new light on american public opinion over the build up to the war
