professor stern puts applied linguistics research into its historical and interdisciplinary perspective he gives an authoritative survey of past developments worldwide and establishes a set of guidelines for the future there are six parts clearing the ground historical perspectives concepts of language concepts of society concepts of language learning and concepts of language teaching

literacy language teaching

starting from the premise that each person develops a unique and personal code for communication christopher brumfit examines the roles of teachers and learners and the approaches that education professionals should develop in support of learners the book draws upon linguistic psychological philosophical and sociolinguistic principles and uses practical examples from second foreign and mother tongue teaching it attempts to integrate theoretical and empirical work with the practical needs of institutions and of teachers without losing sight of learners needs for free personal choice combined with effective communication drawing upon the author s extensive experience in the field it considers the roles of literature and culture as well as language policy in relation to learners rights and attempts to outline a humane and realistic philosophy for language teaching

this book is about the worlds and conflicts of tesol teachers and researchers whose professional lives are both enriched and problematized by the cultural and political interfaces created by working with an international language central to this discussion is the balance of power in classroom and curriculum settings the relationship between language culture and discourse and the change in the ownership of english

this text goes back to basics by investigating fundamental assumptions about the way english should be defined and taught as a foreign language it looks at different attitudes to english teaching and critically examines proposals for course content

providing an introduction this work contains sections on the british empire

this handbook deals with all aspects of contemporary language teaching and its history produced for language teaching professionals it is also useful as a reference work for academic studies at postgraduate level

the globalized use of language calls into question conventional ways of thinking in linguistics applied linguistics and language pedagogy this book critically examines this thinking from an historical at times satirical perspective and proposes an alternative conceptualization the first section defines a number of key concepts about communication which are taken up in subsequent sections and shown to be relevant to the different but related areas of language study issues about the relationship between linguistics and applied linguistics set the scene for a discussion of the nature of discourse and then how this bears on the understanding of the globalised use of english as a lingua franca the final section considers the implications of this perspective on communication for how the subject of english language teaching might be redefined the book is relevant for anyone who sees the need for a critical consideration of established concepts in linguistics and language pedagogy

h g widdowson has played an important and pioneering role in the development of communicative language teaching theory this book develops a rational approach to the teaching of language as communication based on a careful consideration of the nature of language and of the language user s activities it provides a lucid guide through a subject

which is often confused and misrepresented while providing a stimulus to all language teachers to investigate the ideas that inform their own practices

this book takes cultural knowledge in language learning not only as a necessary aspect of communicative competence but as an educational objective in its own right if the aim of foreign language education is to foster cross cultural awareness and self realization language pedagogy needs to come to grips with a range of fundamental issues what do we mean by cultural context can discourse practices be taught like rules of grammar what role does literature play in the development of second language literacy how can learners acquire both an insider s and an outsider s understanding of the foreign culture as expressed through its language by exploring these and other issues the book can help language teachers reflect on their profession and place it within its larger societal and educational context in turn they can help learners become not only skilful users of the language but also active architects of a new cross cultural world order
