the 3 5 2 is a very dynamic and flexible system it can be an ultra attacking formation or solid defensive formation depending on how it is deployed in attack the 3 5 2 is numerically strong in the midfield and comes with the benefit of two strikers creating width in the attack is never a problem with two wingers and strikers that could also run the channels the formation is naturally set up to encourage movement off the ball with the interchanging of positions when in possession the interchanging of positions and movement off the ball allows different players the opportunity to fill different spaces making the 3 5 2 more dynamic and difficult for the opponent to predict and deal with in the modern game i personally find many advantages to playing the 3 5 2 formation due to its fluid attacking potential and less focus on keeping numbers back the defensive side of the 3 5 2 presents the formations biggest challenges yet it can also be seen as a strength if the players understand how to form a back four or five in the correct situations with only three defenders in the back covering space in deep wide areas must be addressed and dealt with effectively in order to offset the possible defensive weakness that come with three players not being able to cover the entire width of the field the coach must choose player personnel and more importantly the formations tactics wisely in this book i will cover multiple ways the 3 5 2 can be played to maximize its strengths while turning the formations possible negatives into positives when breaking down and analyzing any formation it is important to note that the difference between formations is about 10 yards in player positioning you can make an argument that most formations are similar and difficult to identify once the game has started the transition from defending to attacking and attacking to defending creates totally new shapes from the original formation the game of soccer is a free flowing game but inside that flow there must be a structure which drives individual and team decisions the coach is the one who will lay out the important tactical guidelines for the execution of the formation so it is important to note that the same formation can be carried out in many different ways depending on the coach tactics that will influence the way the formation played include things like setting a line of restraint establishing a line of confrontation identifying pressing zones outlining counter attacking areas realizing when to press or drop off addressing the overall style of soccer to be played player personnel work load location of the game weather conditions field conditions and much more all these factors will directly influence the way a formation is played

identifying and solving common real game situation problems in the training environment this is a different way to look at the game rather than highlighting what we need to do well it shows what often goes wrong and how to fix it these are many situations i have found happen in top level games how many of these problems do you experience with your team many of the defensive problems as you will see can easily be fixed just with good 1 on 1 or unit pressing also defensive tactical positioning is covered as is improvements in our attacking play a major improvement is needed though in communication at youth level to help fix all errors in most cases contents 1 attacking shape is often way too narrow 2 we lose the ball with a bad pass where we get countered quickly and caught flat 3 not sliding across and changing who you mark 4 defensive positioning to fix in defensive team shape 5 not pressing the opponents striker all the way 6 not pressing the ball when it is cleared out of the

penalty box 7 poor positioning in and around the 6 yard box from crosses 8 positioning at the back when losing the ball 9 wide players do not recover leaving a 2 v 1 against our fullbacks 10 we defend too deep from free kicks 11 not closing the wide player down 12 allowing opponent midfield players to receive and turn 13 do we drop or press up from the back 14 dropping then pressing 15 they move the ball forward and keep possession we have to press and also recover at the same time 16 we don t press together as a unit in the attacking third 17 changing shape to counter the opponents who are playing a 4 3 3 18 not using spatial awareness correctly off the ball 19 players need to move both for themselves and for teammates also 20 how to regain possession in the attacking third 21 condensing and recovery runs by the defending team on losing possession 22 attacking play and rotations and movements of players 23 how to create third man runs in the attacking third

many coaches use passing patterns and shadow play exercises on a regular basis to increase technical ability improve fitness levels stimulate movement ideas build discipline increase focus encourage coordinated timed multi player movements and establish a group passing tempo there is no doubt that passing patterns and shadow play exercises are valuable for player development however at some point it will become important to use specific patterns that directly fit the teams game model a game model is simply the way you want your team to play it involves the team s style of play identity and formation the way you train at some point should specifically relate to the way you play training model game model this book takes the 4 2 3 1 soccer formation and provides a series of passing patterns and shadow play exercises that directly relate to the teaching of a flexible 4 2 3 1 formation when player s train using these patterns they are simulating many of the movements and passing combinations they will encounter when playing the 4 2 3 1 formation in an actual game i understand that no two coaches are the same and every coach will interpret formations in their own way unique way however i designed this book to teach the 4 2 3 1 formation in a fashion that i consider to be modern flexible and fluid the training exercises are intended to stimulate movement ideas for players by showing them the vast possibilities that are available by playing a flexible 4 2 3 1 system ultimately the goal is to encourage different players to fill different spaces though out the game so players are not just filling the same old predictable spaces assigned to them when a formation is played in a way that it is too robotic and ridged with no real freedom of movement and interchanging of positions it becomes predictable less dynamic boring and ultimately less effective i prefer to let my players operate under the general umbrella of the 4 2 3 1 formation while still allowing them the freedom to make their own movement decisions in order to exploit the opponent the exercises presented in this book will aid you in teaching the concepts and ideas needed to be successful playing a fluid and flexible version of the 4 2 3 1 formation

chapter 1 what is 433 an introduction to the game in soccer formations are the blueprints that teams use to organize their players on the field imagine a painter with a blank canvas the formation is their brushstrokes the 4 3 3 formation is one of the most popular and exciting setups in soccer what does 4 3 3 mean the name says it all 4 defenders 3 midfielders and 3 forwards it s simple to remember and offers a balanced yet attacking style of play but what makes 433 so special we ll break it down 4 defenders these players are the backbone responsible for keeping the opposition from scoring think of them like the walls of a castle 3 midfielders the heart of the team they re the playmakers always moving the ball around and controlling the tempo they connect defense to attack 3 forwards the entertainers these are the players who score the goals make the magic happen and often get the most spotlight chapter 2 the basics of the 433 formation now that we know what

433 is let's get into the positions here's a fun way to remember who does what. Goalkeeper: the unsung hero without them no one else gets a chance to shine. Their job is simple: stop the ball from going in. Right and left backs: they help defend but also have the freedom to attack and whip crosses into the box. Center backs: they're the strongmen of the defense, blocking and clearing balls away from danger. Central midfielders: these players have the toughest job; they need to be everywhere, controlling possession and dictating the play. Think of them as the team's brain. Wingers: these speedy players work down the sides, creating chances and often cutting inside to score or set up their teammates. Center forward: the main striker's job is to score goals. Think of them as the finisher or the goal machine.
