handbook of canadian foreign policy is the most comprehensive book of its kind offering an updated examination of canada s international role some 15 years after the dismantling of the berlin wall ushered in a new era in world politics tackling recent developments in canadian foreign policy the authors of this work spotlight canadian idiosyncrasies within a global context that are defined by wrenching juxtapositions the specialists who have contributed their expertise to this book provide sophisticated analysis conceptual as well as historical rather than simply impressionistic judgments about contemporary events highlighting both well known and understudied topics this handbook presents a marriage of the familiar and the underappreciated that enables readers to grasp much of the complexity of current canadian foreign policy and appreciate the challenges policymakers must meet in the early 21st century

using the historical and comparative approaches of study this book traces the roots of the arab israel conflict in general and the palestine israel conflict in particular as well as canada s role in the thorny issue of the conflict and peace processes through multilateral fora and institutions it shows that the canadian perception and policy while uniquely canadian have operated within the broader anglo american framework of support for a jewish homeland and the two state theory the book argues that three significant factors have impacted canada s outlook and actions firstly canada s perception and policy towards the arab israel conflict have been shaped by religio cultural and historical factors rather than by its acclaimed liberal internationalism second growing economic and commercial interests after the 1973 arab israel war and its perceived national interest made it adopt a more nuanced and balanced approach towards the conflict finally it argues that the elite perception the initiatives by lester pearson and the presence of an active jewish

community have had a significant influence on canadian perception towards the arab israel conflict

between 1951 and 1962 nearly ten billion dollars in long term capital both direct investment and purchase of securities flowed into canada this massive amount represented one third of all long term capital moving among industrial nations its transfer marked the first time since before world war i that the world witnessed such a large scale international movement of capital motivated primarily by a prospect of higher rates of return in capital transfers and economic policy the authors test the theory of the causes and effects of international capital movements against the evidence drawn from canada s experience they explore canada s adjustment to capital flows and show how the operation of her economic policy is affected by the sensitivity of capital flows to the country s interest rates and foreign exchange rate their brilliant analysis is particularly valuable in light of current trends in capital flows among industrial nations and the june 1970 return of the canadian dollar to a flexible exchange rate which put the economy in a working situation similar to that of the fifties

with poverty unemployment and one parent families on the rise in most western democracies government assistance presents an increasingly urgent and complex problem this is the first study to explore canada s family policies in an international context maureen baker looks at the successes and failures of social programs in other countries in search of solutions that might work in canada baker has chosen seven industrialized countries for her comparative study australia france germany the netherlands sweden the united kingdom and the united states these countries experience social and economic strains similar to those felt in canada and though they share certain policy solutions major differences in policy remain baker considers which of the policies in these countries are most effective in reducing poverty enhancing family life and improving the status of women then applies her findings to the canadian situation bringing together research and statistics from the fields of demography political science economics sociology women s studies and social policy this rich multidisciplinary study provides a unique resource for anyone interested in canadian family policy

canadian foreign policy as an academic discipline is in crisis despite its value cfp is often considered a stale and pale subfield of political science with an unfashionably state centred focus this book asks why contributors from both inside and around the field investigate how they came to view themselves as participating in cfp as an academic project or not and what that means for both their intellectual trajectory and the development of the field how were they taught to think about canada how does that affect their interpretation of this country s place in the world and how do they teach the subject themselves the thoughtful essays in this nuanced collection shine a light on issues such as the casualization of academic labour the prospect of indigenizing the field and the relationship between study and

practice more broadly they offer a much needed assessment of the boundaries goals and values of the discipline and an important guide to its revitalization

the academic study of canada has traditionally been the realm of canadian scholars for this reason it is easy for outsiders to view canada as a semi nordic continental utopia existing peacefully under a benign government that seeks only peace and harmony in the world the reality is a more complicated story that is the strength of this outstanding new book written by two young polish scholars specializing in canadian affairs they have put together an impressively researched monograph that combines a detailed analysis outlining a rather basic premise the world has changed dramatically since 1989 and canada has changed with it in this well argued narrative they argue that in recent years canada s foreign policy has become one primarily based on interests rather than the promotion of untainted altruism or stereotypical canadian values they argue that since 1989 canadian foreign policy has moved from the more modest aims of a middle power to a more self assertive role of a selective power pursuing more narrowly chosen priorities and often based on simple profit and loss calculations that have clashed with canada s traditional favorable image in the world even if few outside of canada seemed to notice

this third edition of dennis guest s book provides the most complete and up to date history of social welfare in this country yet it also offers insights into the nuts and bolts of policy creation and explodes recent myths that underlie the current residual approach to social policy such as death by deficit and the inevitable demise of the canada pension plan the emergence of social security in canada is both an important historical resource and an engrossing tale in its own right and it will be of great interest to anyone concerned about canadian social policy

canada is a relatively small player on the world scene but is still big enough to be heard the theme of this year s volume of canada among nations is the need for choices in canadian foreign policy in an environment of fiscal constraint the necessity of choice is related to establishing priorities within the multitude of international organizations to which canada belongs if we can no longer afford to be a member of a large number of international institutions which memberships will we uphold and on what grounds will we decide these questions and others are addressed from a variety of standpoints as in the past each article in canada among nations is a free standing contribution contributors have their own distinctive viewpoints and perspectives on where canada stands in the community of nations and where the country s foreign policy priorities should lie

in this new and updated edition the authors once again examine policy making in one of the most significant areas of activity in the canadian economy natural resources and the environment and discuss the evolution of resource policies from the early era of exploitation to the present era of resource and environmental management using an integrated political economy and policy perspective the book provides an analytic framework from which the foundation of ideological perspectives administrative structures and substantive issues are explored departing from traditional approaches that emphasize a single discipline or perspective it offers an interdisciplinary framework with which to think through ecological political economic and social issues it also provides a multi stage analysis of policy making from agenda setting through the evaluation process the integration of social science perspectives and the combination of theoretical and empirical work make this innovative book one of the most comprehensive analyses of canadian natural resource and environmental policy to date its illumination of the key elements of government policy making in this critical sector and its new outline of the evolution of the kyoto protocol makes it a useful textbook and resource for students of environmental and public policy policy makers and environmental organizations
