from theory of international politics national politics is the realm of authority of administration and of law international politics is the realm of power of struggle and of accommodation states like people are insecure in proportion to the extent of their freedom if freedom is wanted insecurity must be accepted organizations that establish relations of authority and control may increase security as they decrease freedom if might does not make right whether among people or states then some institution or agency has intervened to lift them out of natures realm the more influential the agency the stronger the desire to control it becomes in contrast units in an anarchic order act for their own sakes and not for the sake of preserving an organization and furthering their fortunes within it force is used for ones own interest in the absence of organization people or states are free to leave one another alone even when they do not do so they are
