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the handbook of polish czech and slovak holocaust fiction aims to increase the visibility and show the versatility of works from east central european countries it is the first encyclopedic work to bridge the gap between the literary production of countries that are considered to be main sites of the holocaust and their recognition in international academic and public discourse it contains over 100 entries offering not only facts about the content and motifs but also pointing out the characteristic fictional features of each work and its meaning for academic discourse and wider reception in the country of origin and abroad the publication will appeal to the academic and broader public interested in the representation of the holocaust anti semitism and world war ii in literature and the arts besides prose it also considers poetry and theatrical plays from 1943 through 2018 an introduction to the historical events and cultural developments in poland czechoslovakia czech and slovak republic and their impact on the artistic output helps to contextualise the motif changes and fictional strategies that authors have been applying for decades the publication is the result of long term scholarly cooperation of specialists from four countries and several dozen academic centres

film noir was a cycle in american cinema which first came into prominence during world war ii peaked in the 1950s and began to taper off as a definable trend by 1960 over the years a group of films from the period emerged as noir standards beginning with stranger on the third floor in 1940 however since film noir is too wide ranging it cannot be kept within the narrow limits of the official canon that has been established by film historians consequently several neglected movies made during the classic noir period need to be re evaluated as noir films in out of the shadows expanding the canon of classic film noir gene phillips provides an in depth examination of several key noir films including acknowledged

masterpieces like *Laura*, *The Maltese Falcon*, *Sunset Boulevard* and *Touch of Evil* as well as films not often associated with film noir like *Spellbound*, *A Double Life* and *Anatomy of a Murder*. Phillips also examines overlooked or underappreciated films such as *Song of the Thin Man*, *The Glass Key*, *Ministry of Fear* and *Act of Violence*. Also considered in this reevaluation are significant neo noir films among them *Chinatown*, *Hammett*, *I, a Confidential* and the talented Mr. Ripley. In his analyses Phillips draws upon a number of sources including personal interviews with directors and others connected with their productions, screenplays and evaluations of other commentators. Out of the Shadows explores not only the most celebrated noir films but offers new insight into underrated films that deserve reconsideration of interest to film historians and scholars. This volume will also appeal to anyone who wants a better understanding of the works that represent this unique cycle in American filmmaking.

Harold Pinter was fascinated by film long before the theatre but the importance of his screenplays based on the work of other writers has been overlooked. Renton shows him working from manuscript to final text to engage the spectator in a relationship of desire or anxiety with what is unseen. A newly discovered poem links Pinter to the surrealists and through the surrealists to their contemporary, the psychoanalyst Jacques Lacan. 1901-81. The present study shows Pinter working differently from mainstream cinema, places him at the forefront of film theory and offers a fresh insight into his entire output.

By 1962 he had written an unprecedented string of Broadway hits: *Picnic*, *Bus Stop*, *The Dark at the Top of the Stairs* and *Come Back Little Sheba*. All four plays had become successful films featuring top Hollywood stars. Inge had received a Pulitzer Prize for *Picnic* and an Academy Award for his screenplay *Splendor in the Grass*. Even his long-time friend and mentor Tennessee Williams was envious of his success.
