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darkly hilarious an unexpected bundle of joy o the oprah magazine alice cohen was happy for the first time in years after a difficult divorce she had a new love in her life she was raising a beloved adopted daughter and her career was blossoming then she started experiencing mysterious symptoms after months of tests x rays and inconclusive diagnoses alice underwent a cat scan that revealed the truth she was six months pregnant at age forty four with no prenatal care and no insurance coverage for a high risk pregnancy alice was besieged by opinions from doctors and friends about what was ethical what was loving what was right with the intimacy of a diary and the suspense of a thriller what i thought i knew is a ruefully funny wickedly candid tale a story of hope and renewal that turns all of the knowns upside down

legends are a mirror of the culture that creates them a revealing lens through which to observe society religion history and traditions this volume explores vietnamese legends from 1321 to today tales of gods spirits ghosts giants extraordinary individuals heroes common people and animals it explains the mores thought processes and religions that formed the genesis of vietnamese legends traces the development of legends through time and space and highlights the historical and social differences between northern and southern legends over time this work shows vietnamese legends have evolved from a 14th century means of government propaganda to become a form of news entertainment and thought for the masses

working with children and families what is most helpful is the author's readiness to discuss her own doubts and vulnerabilities community care molly salans has been a storyteller for many years visiting children in deprived areas who have depression adhd and behavioral problems caused by poverty absent fathers depressed mothers run down schools and violence describing her therapy sessions as they happened molly salans puts the children in the context of their lives and recounts her sessions the folk and fairy stories she told and the ones they developed themselves in doing so she shows how storytelling and listening thinking about characters in the stories and talking about alternative endings inspires the imagination compassion and way of thinking needed to cope with such emotionally difficult lives this remarkable book includes over fifteen original children's drawings and reveals the methodology molly uses to help heal these children and their families making it essential for all those involved in therapy and in storytelling

this book serves as both a textbook and reference for faculty and students in lis courses on storytelling and a professional guide for practicing librarians particularly youth services librarians in public and school libraries storytelling art and technique serves professors students and practitioners alike as a textbook reference and professional guide it provides practical instruction and concrete examples of how to use the power of story to build literacy and presentation skills as well as to create community in those same educational spaces this text illustrates the value of storytelling covers the history of storytelling in libraries and offers valuable guidance for bringing stories to contemporary listeners with detailed instructions on the selection preparation and presentation of stories it also provides guidance around the planning and administration of a storytelling program topics include digital storytelling open mics and slams and the neuroscience of storytelling an extensive and helpful section of resources for the storyteller is included in an expanded part v of this edition

mixed magic global local dialogues in fairy tales for young readers considers retellings and adaptations from a glocal context a framework focused on the reciprocal and cross cultural exchange between global processes and local practices and their potential transformative effects the study examines an eclectic range of retellings from the east and west from the 19th century until the present among them orientalized picturebook versions of beauty and the beast and bluebeard disney s animated classics asian versions of hans christian andersen s the little mermaid gene luen yang s graphic novel american born chinese and the fantasy films of hayao miyazaki drawing on theories of globalization cognitive narratology subjectivity and eastern thought the book reveals new implications for intertextual analysis this beautifully illustrated volume is the first sustained study of the effects of global local and east west interchanges on representations of self and others in children s literature and folklore studies

offers stepping stones toward the goal of mutual respect among children of different backgrounds by integrating individual activities giving the hands on activities their authenticity detail and interest

as a genre text not an anthology this text teaches students about literature forms and discusses ways of using literature in the classroom it is used to give students the background they need to evaluate select and use children s literature in their own teaching a database of current literature is provided with the text and will be updated annually
