communication devices have a difficult time initiating social interactions with their peers with a flexible program that can be used for either small groups or individuals from ages 7 years to adult what s so funny humor based activities for social skill development is a relevant and easy to use resource discussing a variety of types of humor on different developmental levels from slapstick to word play this program improves participants abilities to connect and engage with others through the powerful tool of humor
