my thesis asks what it means to live a christian existence i argue that the christian life is well considered as a constant activity in perpetual distance from the freezing definitions of contextual understanding furthermore my work argues that the life of the christian is intimately tied to a relationship with anxiety and guilt that are due to an inevitable failure to abide in this activity that is a life before the divine the christian life is thus one in which the parousia and the need for constant confession are symbiotic the work begins with two discussions of meister eckhart s radical theology the first considers his understanding of god as the sole source of existence and the second his profound offering that the prime christian virtue is detachment i then strengthen this foundational reading with kierkegaard s reflections on freedom guilt anxiety confession ignorant love and perhaps above all his notion of indirect communication as essential to the proper freedom of one blessed by an existence in relation to the offensiveness of christ through these many components eventually offer a kierkegaardian view of the christian life as a life of joyous yet suffering failure my work culminates in a discussion of heidegger discussion of the parousia in paul s letters to the thessalonians i believe that all of these central threads of heidegger s work on bearing the silent call of conscience as a central voice in one s approach and concern for their own being what it means to be full of merits and yet to poetically dwell and what it is to think as a meditative being are deeply informed and well read through his early account of christian facticity and the continual waiting birth of christ and this project too for heidegger is deeply informed by the relationship that all authentic human beings have to their own sense of inauthenticity that the truth of us is also present in the ways we are false

in this publication a doctrine on the beginning of the christian faith it points to the fact that god is working out through jesus christ and his church a redemptive program on the earth redemption is to be the goal and peak of creation there is nothing more profound in the mind and purpose behind god than his plan to redeem god works out his redemption regardless of the restricting powers on the earth the bible says with wicked hands men crucified him in doing so they carried out what was in the determinate counsel and foreknowledge of god acts 2 23 jesus was crucified on our behalf this is his redemptive work as it works itself out in human experience what is becoming a christian what sort of a transaction is it what do we mean by salvation how is a man saved these questions strike a chord when we think about them from the point of view of involvement and life is salvation something that takes place all at once or is it a continuous process the son of man came to seek and to save that which was lost luke 19 10 faithful is the saying and worthy of all acceptance that christ jesus came into the world to save sinners i timothy 1 15 for god so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son that whosoever believeth in him should not perish but have everlasting life john 3 16 for god sent not his son into the world to condemn the world but that the world through him might be saved john 3 17 he that believeth on him is not condemned but he that believeth not is condemned already because he hath believed in the name of the only begotten son of god jesus christ john 3 18 reverend dr john thomas wylie
