listed interviews and assessments of the students with dyslexia ages six to college age illustrate their exceptional skills and talents as well as their needs although early detection and intense intervention by trained dyslexia educators are essential teachers and parents can enhance school and home instruction we can value and infuse these strengths and skills while they are learning and allow them to show what they know in ways other than paper and pencil permeating the arts and steam with instruction engages brain based learning the end goal is to improve student success and confident self image not just for children and teens with dyslexia but also for all students
