accommodation strategy efforts are being made to strike a new balance between the physical mobile and digital

workplace since the formation of the national police there has been an enormous challenge to accommodate the organization in realizing this task the police has the ambition to raise the quality of police buildings as well as the experience users have in the buildings at the same time the police is at the heart of an ever changing society the accommodation needs to meet the requirements posed by several developments such as the energy transition climate change and digitization how do these developments influence the task of future proofing cultural heritage which role can our heritage buildings play in these transitions the key lies in our present actions coupled with the lessons of the past different approaches on built heritage will open our eyes and help with today's issues to see what is valuable will the decisions made in the past be our strength or pitfall how will objects developed in the past exposed to today's spatial developments help us through the power of imagination the studio vacant heritage from heritage and architecture proudly reveals many possibilities

peter eisenman renowned for his own controversial and influential body of work looks at ten leading architects of the twentieth century and their theoretical positions technological innovations and design contributions eisenman identifies a project within the oeuvre of each of these architects luigi moretti ludwig mies van der rohe le corbusier louis kahn robert venturi james stirling aldo rossi rem koolhaas daniel libeskind and frank gehry that has profoundly affected architectural discourse and practice with drawings diagrams and always incisive text he presents each architect's theoretical position and then offers detailed critical analysis of the project

this book examines the central decades of peter eisenman's work through a formal and thematic analysis of key architectural projects and writings revealing underlying characteristics and arguing for their productive continuity and transformative role the book explores eisenman's approach to architectural form generation and thinking it does this through a thematic and formal analysis of projects and writings from the mid 1970s to the mid 1990s following an introductory chapter addressing the theme of potentialities the book is organised in two parts the first part focuses on key period writings of eisenman framing the close reading around a practice of resistance the architect's approach to history as analysis and the transformative conceptualisation of time in the second part the book undertakes an analysis of select projects from the 1980s and 1990s three formal preoccupations and

conceptual orientations ground manipulations figuration and spatial events organise this part of the book previously unpublished material from the peter eisenman fonds canadian centre for architecture montréal provides primary source material a concluding chapter addresses eisenman s teaching its relation to his larger project and possible legacies for educators practitioners scholars and theorists

focusing on six leading contemporary architects peter eisenman frank gehry bernard tschumi zaha hadid rem koolhaas and steven holl this book puts forward a unique and insightful analysis of neo avant garde architecture it discusses the spectacle and excess which permeates contemporary architecture in reference to the present aesthetic tendency for image making but does so by applying the tectonic of theatricality discussed by the 19th century german architect gottfried semper in doing so it breaks new ground by opening up a dialogue between the study of the past and the design of the present the work of each discussed architect is seen as addressing a historiographical problem to this end and this is the second important aspect of this book the chosen buildings are discussed in terms of the thematic of the culture of building the tectonic of column and wall for example rather the formal and this through a discussion that is informed by the latest available theories having set the aesthetic implication of the processes of the digitalization of architecture the book s conclusion highlights strategies by which architecture might postpone the full consequences of digitalization and thus the becoming of architecture as ornament on its own right
