of the hofstra new teachers network reflect the current focus on document based instruction and assessment and can serve as tools for assessing student learning increased attention is given to project based social studies instruction and to multicultural education intended as a text for undergraduate and graduate preservice social studies methods courses this text is also useful for in service training programs as a reference for new social studies teachers and as a resource for experienced social studies educators who are engaged in rethinking their teaching practice
