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this reference grammar provides for the first time a description of the grammar of mandarin chinese the official spoken language of china and taiwan in functional terms focusing on the role and meanings of word level and sentence level structures in actual conversations

a reference grammar of chinese is a comprehensive and up to date guide to the linguistic structure of chinese covering all of the important linguistic features of the language and incorporating insights gained from research in chinese linguistics over the past thirty years with contributions from twenty two leading chinese linguists this authoritative guide uses large scale corpora to provide authentic examples based on actual language use the accompanying online example databases ensure that a wide range of exemplars are readily available and also allow for new usages to be updated this design offers a new paradigm for a reference grammar where generalizations can be

cross checked with additional examples and also provide resources for both linguistic studies and language learning featuring bilingual term lists this reference grammar helps readers to access relevant literature in both english and chinese and is an invaluable reference for learners teachers and researchers in chinese linguistics and language processing

when laurence thompson s original vietnamese grammar first appeared in 1965 it went almost instantly to the top of the list of required reading for serious students of the vietnamese language it has stayed there ever since but in recent years the title has become almost impossible to find either in bookstores or in libraries where original copies have often grown woefully ragged and marked up or are now simply missing in the meanwhile the author has become aware of a number of minor infelicities and typographical errors requiring correction thus both demand and scholarship have dictated this re edition from the editor s note

bislama is the national language of vanuatu the world s most linguistically diverse nation with at least 80 actively spoken oceanic languages used by about 200 000 people bislama began as a plantation pidgin based on english in the nineteenth century but it has since developed into a unique language with a grammar and vocabulary very different from english it is one of very few national languages for which there is no readily available reference grammar this book aims to fill this gap by providing an extensive account of the grammar of bislama as it is used by ordinary ni vanuatu it does not therefore aim to describe any kind of artificial written norm but sets out to capture a range of different kinds of ways that ni vanuatu will say things in various contexts both written and spoken formal and informal the thrust of this volume is to show that bislama has a grammar an unfamiliar concept for those educated in vanuatu it also shows that bislama is a language of considerable complexity which will come as a surprise to many of its users who have been taught to view their language as somehow simple and even deficient

a reference grammar of dutch is aimed at english speaking students of dutch at beginner intermediate level it is designed to be practical and user friendly grammatical information is presented in short entries arranged in alphabetical order allowing students to gain easy access to specific points of grammar or problematic points of vocabulary as they encounter them in practice each grammatical rule is illustrated by simple everyday dutch examples of the kind likely to be encountered and used by the learner specialised linguistic terminology is kept to a minimum with a glossary of essential terms provided and charts and tables are included to help the student focus on the main points each entry is linked to a set of exercises which are graded according to complexity and there is a key to the exercises at the back of the book a thorough index is also provided

a reference grammar of modern standard arabic is a comprehensive handbook on the structure of arabic keeping technical terminology to a minimum it provides a detailed yet accessible overview of arabic in which the essentials of its phonology morphology and syntax can be

readily looked up and understood accompanied by extensive examples it will prove an invaluable practical guide for supporting students textbooks classroom work or self study and will also be a useful resource for scholars and professionals wishing to develop an understanding of the key features of the language

a reference grammar of french is a lively wide ranging and original handbook on the structure of the french language it includes new information on register pronunciation gender number foreign words latin arabic english spanish italian adjectives and past participles used as nouns texting word order frequency of occurrence of words and usage with all geographical names examples come not only from france but also from quebec belgium and switzerland readers will appreciate the initial passages illustrating the grammatical features of a given chapter also included is a user friendly introduction to the french language from its latin origins to modern times a full glossary explains any terms that might confuse the less experienced reader and the index leads the student through the detailed labyrinth of grammatical features this handbook will be an invaluable resource for students and teachers who want to perfect their knowledge of all aspects of french grammar

writing systems both hangul and chinese characters are delineated with admirable clarity tables of chinese characters in common use including those with multiple readings and a valuable appendix of the radicals and their names will prove indispensable to students seeking help in identifying and understanding the characters chapters include explanations of various romanization systems historical overview of phonological developments chinese vocabulary and characters number constructions and counting systems detailed listings of parts of speech and their functions description of verb stems and endings explanation of sentence construction and translation difficulties detailed appendixes include lists of korean surnames place names radical names and stem shapes a thorough index that makes the book easy to use this comprehensive volume deserves a place in every research library it is the definitive reference work for all those involved in korean studies
