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blade runner has left an indelible mark on popular culture adapted from philip k dick s novel do androids dream of electric sheep it anticipated with remarkable prescience the world in which we have lived for the past four decades ridley scott s breathtaking vision of a futuristic and cosmopolitan metropolis created an aesthetic and cognitive shock that continues to resonate to this day not only in cinema but in multiple artistic and even scientific domains the film is often cited in debates related to robotics biopolitics posthumanism urban planning and critical theory denis villeneuve s sequel blade runner 2049 continues to explore these themes while introducing issues related to artificial intelligence transhumanism and climate change
