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the role of phonetic detail within the language system and its interplay with other kinds of linguistic information represent a hotly

debated territory in the current volume different types of phonetic nuances are examined with a particular focus on their relation to phonological morphological and semantic pragmatic phenomena these three interfaces the phonetic phonological the phonetic morphological and the phonetic semantic pragmatic one are investigated from a variety of angles and by consistently taking the rapport between phonetics and phonology into consideration in doing so we provide an up to date picture of research dealing with the interaction of distinct linguistic areas and also discuss the question if and when phonology is needed to mediate between phonetics and other linguistic domains

this book offers a laboratory phonological analysis of the sonority hierarchy and natural classes in nasal harmony using an artificial grammar learning paradigm it is aimed at postgraduate students and linguists in general whose research interests lie in phonology phonetics and or psycholinguistics it is useful for linguists who are struggling to figure out how to effectively design an artificial phonological grammar and those who have not designed experiments on their own but would like to do so as an additional means to testing linguistic theories this book is also a valuable resource for anyone building crosslinguistic artificial grammar paradigm resources

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in 1997 eisenbrauns published the highly regarded two volume phonologies of asia and africa edited by alan kaye with the assistance of peter t daniels and the book rapidly became the standard reference for the phonologies of the afro asiatic languages now the concept has been extended and kaye has assembled nearly 50 scholars to write essays on the morphologies of the same language group the
