sieges determined the course of the english civil wars yet they receive scant attention in contrast the major set piece battles are repeatedly analyzed and reassessed as a result our understanding of the conflict and of its outcome is incomplete john barratt in this lucid and perceptive account makes the siege the focal point of his study as well as looking at the theory and practice of siege warfare and fortification he considers the often devastating human impact using a selection of graphic examples he shows how siege warfare could ruin the lives of the soldiers and the civilians caught up in it he examines in detail a dozen sieges using a combination of eyewitness accounts other contemporary sources archaeological surveys and other modern research his study provides a detailed and vivid
