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in this highly acclaimed revision grammatical descriptions and teaching suggestions are organized into sections dealing with form meaning and use the grammar book second edition helps teachers and future teachers grasp the linguistic system and details of english grammar providing more information on how structures are used at the discourse level

many students of english as a second language are daunted by the complexities of english grammar and its terminology this user friendly book was written especially for them the emphasis here is on practical use of written and spoken american style english rather than on theory the first of the book s 15 chapters explains different kinds of sentences affirmative negative and interrogative as well as clauses and phrases that are component parts of many sentences several chapters that follow focus on different parts of speech describing their uses in verbal and written communication the book s later chapters discuss vocabulary standard protocols in conversational speech and modes of expression such as preferences and dislikes a separate chapter presents guidelines for composing letters e mails r sum s and other written forms short quizzes for self testing appear throughout the text with answers given at the back of the book

a guide for high intermediate and advanced esl efl students offers advice on doing research creating an outline and planning drafting revising and editing research papers

this short introductory guide to using games in the esl efl classroom gives some guiding principles for creating and selecting which games to use and then gives three in depth examples of games you can make for your own classroom with photos of the games in use and a discussion of adaptations and variations while all of the example language is from english teaching contexts the games would work equally well to teach other languages

this book is intended for classroom or individual study for students who need to clean up their grammar at the word level in preparation for university level academic writing it presents 60 words or phrases that are frequently problematic for advanced students of english exposing the errors explaining them and providing examples of correct usage the

most important points are summarized as tips and students have the opportunity to write their own sentences with the expressions

what elements make a speaking activity successful which tasks or activities really help build speaking fluency what does the research show regarding speaking activities what mistakes do esl teachers often make in speaking activity design in this highly accessible and practical resource keith s folse provides a wealth of information to help esl efl teachers design and use speaking tasks that will actually improve students speaking fluency the book presents and discusses the relevant research and assessment issues and includes case studies from twenty different settings and classrooms around the world so that readers learn from others about the problems and successes of using various speaking activities teachers will find the chapters on twenty successful activities and ten unsuccessful activities particularly valuable the successful activities are provided for classroom use and are reproducible the book also contains five appendixes that explain what teachers need to know about vocabulary pronunciation and grammar and how they affect the teaching of speaking samples of successful lesson plans and a list of resources useful for teaching speaking are also included keith s folse ph d is coordinator tesol programs university of central florida orlando he is the author of vocabulary myths university of michigan press 2004 and more than 35 second language textbooks including texts on grammar reading speaking listening and writing

the emergency english teacher contains an extensive collection of tried and tested activities and games which can be used in any esl efl classroom most english teachers don t just teach one age group or ability level and the book reflects this by containing ideas that are suitable for all levels of students from young beginners to competent speakers all of the activities in this book have been adapted to help develop one or more aspects of the students language skills they are also fun and enjoyable and your students will often request

you to repeat them regularly the benefits of this book for teachers are no preparation low preparation there is no need to photocopy anything you don't need to spend a fortune at the stationery shop or hours on pre class preparation just read the instructions and you are ready to go they're quick every activity displays a set up time which tells the teacher how long the activity will take to set up in the classroom this even allows the book to be referenced quickly in class during those lesson gap emergencies when a class runs short the overarching themes of this book are student empowerment after the teacher has initially organized an activity one or two times many of the activities can be handed over to the students to plan organize and run themselves this greatly increases the opportunity for the students to use english for a functional purpose how english is used naturally rather than a display purpose what i call textbook english teacher monitoring this book often emphasises the importance of teacher monitoring when the teacher hands over the responsibility for the running of an activity to the students they are effectively stepping out of the circle what this allows the teacher to do is to really get down to observing their students using english for communicative purposes the teacher will be able to assess how well the students are using the language structures they have been taught and plan for error correction strategies in post activity classes the teacher will also be able to observe where the students are reaching the limits of their current language abilities which will aid them in the formation of future lesson plans
