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this second edition of the history of the english language a sourcebook provides a comprehensive and accessible guide to the origins and development of the english language first published in 1992 the book contains over fifty illustrative

passages drawn from the oldest english to the twentieth century the passages are contextualised by individual introductions and grouped into the traditional periods of old english early middle english later middle english early modern english and modern english these periods are connected by brief essays explaining the major linguistic developments associated with each period to produce a continuous outline history for this new edition professor burnley has expanded the outline of linguistic features at each of the main chronological divisions and included more selections and illustrations a new section has also been included to illustrate the language of advertising from the 18th century to the present the book will be of general interest to all those interested in the origins and development of the english language and in particular to students and teachers of the history of the english language at a level and university

this useful sourcebook contains 12 chapters written by experienced classroom practitioners in hong kong one theme appears constantly in these chapters that in the english language classroom whether at primary secondary or tertiary levels high interest and positive motivation occur through active learning when literary texts literary techniques and literariness are featured in this book full coverage is given to the use of poetry prose and drama in language learning and teaching at all three levels of the education system the tasks and activities described here have been shown to work with all bands of students this book is ideally suited both for practising teachers and participants in teacher education programmes in hong kong and the rest of s e asia it will be particularly useful for primary and secondary teachers of english wishing to incorporate appropriate and relevant teaching activities so as to meet the goals of the new target oriented english language curriculum

enhance their awareness of earlier contributions to the field

from its first edition the purpose of walford has been to identify and evaluate the widest possible range of reference materials no rigid definition of reference is applied in addition to the expected bibliographies indexes dictionaries encyclopaedias and directories a number of important textbooks and manuals of general practice are included while the majority of the items are books walford is a guide to reference material thus periodical articles microforms online and cd rom sources are all represented in this volume a particular effort has been made to improve coverage of the latter two categories

north borneo sourcebook seeks to address the lack of available data for the languages of northern borneo where forty to fifty distinct languages are spoken in the malaysian state of sabah alone while members of the summer institute of linguistics sil have worked in sabah for several decades and have published articles on individual languages until now no comprehensive survey of the languages of sabah had yet been done in addition to the languages native to sabah also included in this monograph are closely related southwest sabah languages spoken in neighboring parts of the malaysian state of sarawak the indonesian province of kalimantan utara and brunei darussalam the author has included 594 entries with equivalents in each of the forty six languages that represent the linguistic variation in north borneo along with introductory sections listing the personal pronouns demonstrative pronouns and case markers for each language this sourcebook thus fills a critical need in surveying the languages of a single large area in an island of southeast asia many language communities in this region are endangered and likely to disappear as functioning entities within the next generation or two this book may be the only record we will ever have of their existence linguists and those with an interest in austronesian languages will appreciate the breadth and detail that illuminate the linguistic scene in an area

for almost a thousand years language has been an important and contentious issue in Ireland but above all it reflects the great themes of Irish history colonial invasion native resistance religious and cultural difference collected here for the first time are texts on language from the date of the first legislation against the Irish the Statute of Kilkenny 1366 to the constitution of the Free State in 1922 Crowley's introduction connects these texts to current debates giving the Belfast Agreement as a textual example and illustrating that the language debates continue today divided into six historical sections with detailed editor's introductions this unique sourcebook includes familiar cultural texts such as essays and letters by Yeats along side less familiar writings including the preface to the New Testament in Irish 1602 providing direct access to original texts this is an historical resource book which can be used as a case study in the relations between language and cultural identity

this major reference work fills a need long recognized in neurolinguistics a source for analyzable speech transcripts from agrammatic aphasic patients that provides detailed grammatical descriptions and distributional analyses this 3 volume set is unique in that it presents narrative speech from carefully selected clinically comparable patients speakers of 14 languages and parallel narratives by normal speakers for each of the 14 languages there is a case presentation chapter analyzing and discussing the language of agrammatic patients followed by primary data which are organized as follows running text of speech by two patients interlinear morphemic translations of those texts running text of speech elicited from two normal control subjects plus interlinear translations tables and figures analyzing distributional properties of the patients speech results of comprehension tests of the patients transcriptions of patients oral reading and writing samples neurological information is included with the case presentations and a short grammatical sketch of each language is added to make the work on all languages accessible even to those who only read english language findings are presented for english dutch german icelandic swedish french italian polish serbo croatian hindi finnish hebrew chinese and japanese the book is an indispensable reference work for all linguists psycholinguists and neurolinguists who wish to test their theories against a massive body of data

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
