if carpentier is ever to get a new reading in english it should be now west s translations reintroduce english language readers to this giant of latin american fiction
natasha wimmer the new york review of books the best known book by cuba s most important twentieth century novelist in its first new english translation in more
than sixty years and featuring a new introduction by leonardo padura a penguin classic dissatisfied with his empty sisyphus like existence in new york city where he
has abandoned his creative dreams for a job in corporate advertising a highly cultured aspiring composer wants nothing more than to tear his life up from the root
he soon finds his escape hatch a university sponsored mission to south america to look for indigenous musical instruments in one of the few areas of the world not
