the way around is the kind of book my soul perpetually yearns for it reshaped how i see the world robert moor author of on trails an exploration growing up in northern california in a family of high achieving athletes nicholas triolo was imbued with a particularly acute form of our intensely goal oriented culture do the reps he internalized commit to the work grind for your dreams shortly after graduating from college he embarked on a solo circumnavigation of the globe and then after returning to the states he threw himself into ultrarunning all to combat a deepening discontent while traveling around the world it was in kathmandu that triolo first encountered kora a form of moving prayer in which pilgrims walk in circles around a sacred site or object a kind of ritualized remembering birthed by place unable to shake this initial encounter with circumambulation he sets out here on three such extended walks first he completes the sacred thirty two mile revolution around tibet's mount kailash in search of a cultural counter to western linearity then following his mother's diagnosis with breast cancer he returns home to california and takes part in an annual circuit of mount tamalpais tracing a route made famous by beat poets gary snyder philip whalen and allen ginsberg and then finally he meets up with a quirky hydrogeologist in butte montana and joins his walk around the berkeley pit complex the largest superfund site in the country at once uncommonly humble and thrillingly transcendent blurring the boundaries of inner and outer
