timely and authoritative this unique handbook explores the breadth of current knowledge on temperament from foundational theory and research to clinical applications leaders in the field examine basic temperament traits assessment methods and what brain imaging and molecular genetics reveal about temperament's biological underpinnings the book considers the pivotal role of temperament in parent

child interactions attachment peer relationships and the development of adolescent and adult personality and psychopathology innovative psychological and educational interventions that take temperament into account are reviewed integrative in scope the volume features extensive cross referencing among chapters and a forward looking summary chapter

temperament is the first monograph in 40 years to present theories and basic findings in the field of temperament from a broad international and interdisciplinary perspective the text based on the author s four decades of personal study and data collection thoroughly explores the physiological biochemical and genetic bases of temperament incorporating age specific methods of assessment developed through child and adult oriented approaches the 147 illustrations comprise tables of the most popular temperament inventories for both children and adults and unique data tables illustrating the psychometric features of temperament inventories based on self rating and rating by others

this is the third book in a series of across the life span volumes that has come from the biennial life span development conferences the authors well known in their fields present theoretical and research issues important for the understanding of temperament in infancy and childhood as well as personality in adolescence and adulthood current findings placed within theoretical and historical contexts make each chapter distinctive the chapter authors focus on their work and its implications for temperament and personality issues across the life span in addition they include summaries of research by other investigators and theorists placing their work and that of others in a lifespan perspective

originally published in 1928 this title attempts to give a short historical outline of the treatment which temperament had received at the hands of psychological theory from the time of hippocrates temperament had figured in philosophical and psychological writings as one of the constituents which determine behaviour the language in which it had been treated had been vague and obscure and this combined with the equally indeterminate associations which were carried over from the speech of everyday life at the time had contrived to surround the subject with an atmosphere of unreality which was in sharp contrast to the significance of the role assigned to it

originally published in 1984 this title looks at the development of temperament in early life at the time of publication there were three major perspectives on temperament paediatrics individual differences in infants and inherited personality traits that appear in early life whatever the diversity of these perspectives they converge on personality traits that develop early in life hence the title of this book the authors start by looking at the main research in this field then go on to discuss their

own approach to temperament building on their original theory from 1975

the growing interest in research on temperament during the last decade has been recorded by several authors e g r plomin j e bates from such sources of information as the social sciences citation index or psychological abstracts the editors inquiry shows that the number of cases in which the term temperament was used in the title of a paper or in the paper s abstract published in psychological abstracts reveals an essential increase in research on temperament during the years 1975 to 1979 the term temperament was used in the title and or summary of 173 abstracts i e 34 6 publications per year during the next five years 1980 1984 it was used in 367 abstracts 73 4 publications per year whereas in the last five years 1985 to 1989 the term has appeared in 463 abstracts that is in 92 6 publications per year even if the review of temperament literature is restricted to those abstracts it can easily be concluded that temperament is used in different contexts and with different meanings hardly allowing any comparisons or general statements one of the consequences of this state of affairs is that our knowledge on temperament does not cumulate despite the increasing research activity in this field this situation in temperament research motivated the editors to organize a one week workshop on the diagnosis of temperament bielefeld federal republic of germany september 1987

first published in 1986 the modern history of temperament research began in the late 1950s with the new york longitudinal study twenty five years later temperament has

become a major focus of research on early developing emotional and social traits the impetus for this growth in temperament research stems from the merging of several shifts in child development research from a view of the child as passive to a model of the child as an active transacting partner with the environment increasing interest in individual differences in development an expansion of research on emotional and social development and a clear change from an exclusive reliance on environmental explanations of developmental differences to a more balanced perspective that recognizes the possibility of biological as well as environmental influences most stimulating is the multidisciplinary flavor of temperament research clinicians infancy researchers cultural anthropologists and behavioral geneticists have each for their own reasons been drawn to the study of temperament each of these fields is represented in the present volume which provides the first overview of the growing field of temperament

in their attempts to understand the nature of musicianship music psychologists have generally focused their attention on cognitive processes and abilities although a kind of folklore has long existed in musical circles relating to personality differences between players of different instruments this is the first book to examine the impact of personality and temperament on musicianship after an introductory chapter which summarizes the relevant personality theories the book deals with each fact of the musicians personality in turn introversion independence sensitivity anxiety and gender issues different forms of musicianship such as orchestral playing singing and conducting are considered next to clarify the ways in which specific skills impact upon personality development or predispose a person towards different instruments and styles of performance

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
