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traces the genesis consolidation and consequences of the postmodern idea beginning in the

hispanic world of the 1930s the text takes the reader through to the 70s when lyotard and habermas gave the idea of postmodernism wider currency and finally the 90s with the work of fredric jameson

reads and interprets eight works of literature by people of color foregrounding the philosophical debate about modernity vs postmodernity rather than solely issues of race

since its first appearance in 1981 critical regionalism has enjoyed a celebrated worldwide reception the 1990s increased its pertinence as an architectural theory that defends the cultural identity of a place resisting the homogenising onslaught of globalisation today its main principles such as acknowledging the climate history materials culture and topography of a specific place are integrated in architects education across the globe but at the same time the richer cross cultural history of critical regionalism has been reduced to schematic juxtapositions of the global with the local retrieving both the globalising branches and the overlooked cross cultural roots of critical regionalism resisting

postmodernity s transcending devaluing god in one way undertakes a history of the concept of the aesthetic sublime in another it is an exploration of the limits of theological thinking where theology is understood either as a practice arising from faith or from thinking by examining concepts like soul experience analogy and truth the author issues a provocative challenge to much contemporary christian theology to return to a more serious engagement with philosophy hemming explores the confrontation with god and the gods to be found in protagoras plato aristotle aquinas hegel nietzsche heidegger and derrida often offering innovative readings of these thinkers sharply at odds with accounts to be found elsewhere

peripheralizing delillo tracks the historical arc of don delillo s poetics as it recomposes itself across the genres of short fiction romance the historical novel and the philosophical novel of time drawing on theories that capital rather than the bourgeoisie is the displaced subject of the novel thomas travers investigates delillo s representation of fully commodified social worlds and re evaluates marxist accounts of the novel and its philosophy of history deploying an innovative re periodisation travers considers the evolution of delillo s aesthetic forms as they register and encode one of the crises of contemporary historicity the secular dynamics through which a society organised around waged work tends

towards conditions of under and unemployment situating delillo within global histories of uneven and combined development travers explores how delillo s treatment of capital and labour affect and narration reconfigures debates around realism and modernism the delillo that emerges from this study is no longer an exemplary postmodern writer but a composer of capitalist epics a novelist drawn to peripheral zones of accumulation zones of social death whose surplus populations his fiction strives to re historicise if not re dialecticise as subjects of history
