book 2 of 2 has pamphlets 098 through 169 over the years undoubtedly hundreds if not thousands of leaflets tracts and even small booklets have been produced by multiple entities of the seventh day adventist organization for the purpose of communication within its own membership one hundred and sixty nine of this type of publication that was produced during the ministry of mrs e g white or shortly thereafter has become known as the ellen g white pamphlets the ellen white written material in these 169 pamphlets along with some of the material contributed by other church leaders is presently available on the ellen g white cd rom a printed photo copy edition of the pamphlets has previously been available in a four volume set this printed edition contained all of the material originally provided by the other church leaders some eighteen percent of the total by word count some of the pamphlets contain only material by ellen white some have major portions contributed by other church leaders some are compilations on topics such as stewardship diet mixed bathing royalties for book writers etc some were produced to explain the reasons for and progress of certain projects such as the move of church headquarters from battle creek to the washington d c area and the establishing of our work in the southern united states after the civil war as we relive how our people related to and overcame difficulties during those early years we are reminded how the lord has led us in our past experience and our faith is strengthened for the future this present publication contains all of the material originally found in the 169 pamphlets

thus helping to maintain the context of the inspired counsels through ellen white by placing the material in easy to read 10 point font it has been possible to provide it all in this two volume set all emphases are from the originals the pagination of the original document is placed at the bottom of each pamphlet page in curly brackets eg 123 these original page numbers should be included in any reference to the pamphlet material

pioneers also included are related letters from w w prescott w c white james white uriah smith c c crisler edson white and dr david paulson as time has been prolonged these materials are becoming recognized as of great importance to every member of god s remnant church that keeps the commandments of god and has the testimony of jesus christ these inspired and inspiring counsels have been distributed on a private publication basis since 1915 1916 the term unpublished in its title was in reference to it not being published by the white estate or the church organization in 1990 the ellen g white estate included the ellen white portion of the materials on version 1 0 of the ellen g white writings on compact disc with the title spm spalding and magan collection 1985 this present version is a complete and unabridged edition of the original 1915 1916 unpublished compilation by a w spalding and p t magan the material from all of the above named original contributors is included and not just the ellen white material as on the white estate cd minor typographical errors have been largely corrected rarely has a word or two been added in square brackets to help clarify the meaning there is still phrasing present the meaning of which is not the most clear this wording has not been changed the original pagination is indicated in curly brackets 176 all quotations from these writings should be indicated by reference to these page numbers the original page number 176 is at the top of the original page thus each quotation is to be found and referenced to the original page number that precedes it all emphasis is as it appeared in the original compilation most of the articles are indexed by subject and class which is indicated by capital letters in square brackets following the date of writing or of first publication the code for this classification is immediately below history tends to repeat itself these inspired instructions regarding the early work of our church are proving to be a great blessing as we are increasingly involved in its final work class of subjects e educationf financeg church governmenth homei inspiration includes doctrine prophecy counsel exhortation m medical includes diet personal hygiene healing s southern field

for nearly 150 years the review and herald has been the official church paper of the seventh day adventist people a paper the present truth was first printed in august 1849 in 1851 the name was changed to second advent review and sabbath herald over the decades the church paper has carried a number of names and as of 2012 it is simply adventist review our church paper actually preceded by fourteen years the official organization of the seventh day adventist church in 1863 from its inception throughout her life the messenger of the lord ellen g white used the review and herald as one of the main avenues of communicating god s counsels to his remnant people during that sixty six year span nearly 2 000 messages by god of direction reproof and inspiration were published in the review and herald this present edition has all of her articles published through 1915 unabridged in four volumes ellen g white passed away friday july 16 1915 upon hearing of her death arthur w spalding penned the following lines that appeared in the advent review and sabbath herald of july 29 1915 and israel mourned upon the sweet sabbatic calm the evil tidings swept and hushing every joyful psalm an orphaned people wept alas that human lips must tell the somber message dread o israel o israel thy godly seer is dead long long the tale of freighted years that marked the judge s seat from shiloh s mingled hopes and fears to ramah s counsel sweet the chorus of their graces swell the lamentation sore o israel o israel thy prophet speaks no more what hand hath not that guidance felt or sore pressed heart that touch when wayward life its impulse dealt and sorrow overmuch what tender memories compel that saddened low refrain o israel o israel thy messenger is slain but hush thou jacob feeble faint beset by traitor foe take thee a pean for thy plaint a kingdom for thy blow with seer and prophet all is well loud let the heavens ring o israel o israel prepare to meet thy king in an editorial of the same review and herald issue the editor francis m wilcox stressed the point that though dead the messenger of the lord still speaks through her published works set as a teacher in israel she was true to the trust imposed upon her with unswerving fidelity she bore her testimony as the spirit of god directed her utterance in reproof in exhortation in

encouragement as a special watchman upon zion s walls as the messenger of god she never faltered in bearing the burden which this ministry imposed how often during her long ministry has she stood in the breach to call israel back to their allegiance to god how often has she rebuked sin in high places in the church she has not betrayed her trust but has proved loyal to the position appointed her of the great influence exerted by her words spoken and written we need not speak the judgment will reveal we believe a wonderful fruitage of the labors of this devout servant though dead she still speaks her works follow her they still live to bless the church her stirring appeals her exhortations her instructions in the divine life are still left us to these we can still seek for the help which personally she is powerless to give we shall miss our beloved sister but we trust that we shall treasure even more carefully the instruction that she has given us if we shall do this if we shall turn to the lord with all our hearts

contains the articles by ellen g white which appeared in the book a solemn appeal relative to the solitary vice and abuses and excesses of the marriage relation published in 1870 by the steam press of battle creek articles include appeal to mothers the marriage relation obedience to the law of god female modesty and sentimentalism about the authorellen gould harmon white co founder of the seventh day adventist church writer lecturer and counselor and one upon whom seventh day adventists believe the gift of prophecy was bestowed was born in gorham maine november 26 1827 one of eight children of robert and eunice harmon during her seventy years of active service to the church she found time to write voluminously she is credited with having written 100 000 manuscript pages this remarkable legacy to the church could alone have occupied ellen white s entire life had she dedicated her time to little else but writing however her service for the church embraces much more than writing her diaries tell of her public work her travels her personal labor hostessing contacts with neighbors as well as of her being a mother and housewife god blessed her abundantly in these activities her ambitions and concerns her satisfactions and joys her sorrows her whole life were for the advancement of the cause she loved ellen g white is reputed to be the most translated woman author and the most translated author in american history after a full life dedicated to the service of god and others she died on july 16

1915 confidently trusting in him whom she believed

Steps to Christ is an evangelistic book written by Ellen G. White, co-founder and prophetess of the Seventh-day Adventist Church. It was first published in 1892 by Fleming H. Revell Company. The copyright was purchased by Seventh-day Adventist Publisher Review and Herald Publishing Association in 1892 and was first printed there in 1896. A new first chapter, "God's Love for Man," was added per request of the Seventh-day Adventist Publishing House in the United Kingdom, Stanborough Press, in 1893 in order to secure a copyright. This is perhaps the most popular and widely read book by the author, printed in more than 150 languages worldwide. Steps to Christ discusses how to come to know Jesus Christ at a personal level; it covers the topics of repentance, confession, faith, acceptance, growing into Christ, and prayer.

The Seventh-day Adventist prophet Ellen Gould Harmon White (1827-1915) wrote all her letters and manuscripts by hand. These holographs were edited and polished by her secretaries; they corrected her grammar and spelling, deleted and substituted words, and rearranged sentences. The holographs are only available to scholars who receive permission to see them at Adventist Church headquarters in Silver Spring, Maryland, but facsimiles of many of these holographs have been published in various books and research documents. This book explores those holographs and shows what sorts of historical evidence can only be seen by examining those original documents. It also describes the revisions made after the first publication of some of her writings, most notably her first vision, her testimonies for the church, and her book *The Great Controversy*. The historical evidence demonstrates that Ellen White's writings are not without errors and discusses the controversies that arose between those who were correcting her writings and those who claimed she made no errors; they believed her inspired writings should not be changed at all.



this volume is a comprehensive selection of ellen g white s published writings from the 1850s along with a prologue explaining the historical background of the text the autobiographical section of the book describes the author s conversion experience the millerite movement of 1840 1844 and the early visions that formed the foundation of her theology and ministry a second section contains counsel on various matters pertaining the experience of the early adventist believers the final half of the book traces salvation history from the fall of satan in heaven to the final end of sin and sinners this material forms the core of the later five volume conflict of the ages series ellen white s bold apocalyptic imagery helped to shape a movement centered on the hope of the second coming this volume bears witness that god continues to reveal himself through dreams and visions to chosen individuals today

ellen white s two thousand visions revered by her twenty million disciples were doctrinally inspired by william miller who fathered the largest millennial movement in us history he and samuel snow during the movement s climax the midnight cry predicted christ s second coming for exactly october 22 1844 on the basis of fifteen proof texts ellen was twelve suffering from severe brain trauma and the conviction that she was hell bound when miller converted her by sixteen she became convicted that she was having divine dreams and visions confirming miller s prophetic role and message when miller s predictions failed and he repudiated his own predictions ellen announced that god had commanded her to endorse miller s failed midnight cry as divinely inspired and her authority replaced miller s in the shut door faction of ex millerites who evolved into the seventh day adventist church miller claimed that his dogmas were the result of merely allowing the bible to interpret itself and that his method was literal commonsense white seconded this claim and said god s angels routinely guided miller s interpretations however not only were his interpretations falsified but examination reveals them to be farfetched allegorical treatments of parables nonetheless

white s visions and sda theology still retain many of miller s falsified predictions
