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inspired by a terrifying true story from the author's hometown a heart pounding novel of suspense about a small minnesota community where nothing is as quiet or as safe as it seems cassie mcdowell's life in 1980s minnesota seems perfectly wholesome she lives on a farm loves school and has a crush on the nicest boy in class yes there are her parents strange parties and their parade of deviant guests but she's grown accustomed to them all that changes when someone comes hunting in lilydale one by one local boys go missing one by one they return changed violent moody and withdrawn what happened to them becomes the stuff of shocking rumors the accusations of who's responsible grow just as wild and dangerous town secrets start to surface then cassie's own sister undergoes the dark change if

she is to survive cassie must find her way in an adult world where every sin is justified and only the truth is unforgivable

shortlisted for the green carnation prize 2014 this is not a fairytale this is a story about how sex and money and power police our dreams clear eyed witty and irreverent laurie penny is as ruthless in her dissection of modern feminism and class politics as she is in discussing her own experiences in journalism activism and underground culture this is a book about poverty and prejudice online dating and eating disorders riots in the streets and lies on the television the backlash is on against sexual freedom for men and women and social justice and feminism needs to get braver penny speaks for a new feminism that takes no prisoners a feminism that is about justice and equality but also about freedom for all it s about the freedom to be who we are to love who we choose to invent new gender roles and to speak out fiercely against those who would deny us those rights it is a book that gives the silenced a voice a voice that speaks of unspeakable things

controlled and fearless perfection the washington post jamaica kincaid s brother devon died of aids on 19 january 1996 at the age of 33 this poetic and shockingly candid recounting of her brother s life and death is also the story of her family in antigua centred round her destructive mother and a portrait of an illness misunderstood from one of today s most iconic writers my brother is a remarkable record of a life that ended too early it speaks to the difficult truths at the heart of all families now in the picador collection

penury of their lives and the sense of being in hiding even in new york that life is a test of courage and silence maria witnessing the family s strange comings and goings being regaled at night when most are asleep with the intoxicating thrilling stories of their secret pasts of lives lived in saint petersburg of husbands being sent to the front and large dangerous debts owed to the tsar of imperial russia of late night visits by coach to the palace of the romanovs to beg for mercy and avoid execution and at the heart of the stories told through the long nights with no dawn in sight the strange electrifying tale of a pact made in desperation with the private adviser to the tsar and tsarina the mystic faith healer grigory rasputin russian for debauched one a pact of companionship between anna the rat and the scheming siberian peasant turned holy man called the devil by some the self proclaimed only true christ meeting night after night in rasputin s apartments and the spellbinding unspeakable things done there in the name of penance and pleasure

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the theme of this book is the self generation of information by the self modification of systems the author explains why biological and cognitive processes exhibit identity changes in the mathematical and logical sense this concept is the basis of a new organizational principle which utilizes shifts of the internal semantic relations in systems there are mathematical discussions of various classes of systems turing machines input output systems synergetic systems non linear dynamics etc which are contrasted with the author s new principle the most important implications of this include a new conception on the nature of information and which also provides a new and coherent conceptual view of a wide class of natural systems this book merits the attention of all philosophers and scientists concerned with the way we create reality in our mathematical representations of the world and the connection those representations have with the way things really are

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
