this book examines president suharto s effort to purge indonesia of communism ensure the left could never again pose a threat to the regnant order in indonesia and promote anticommunist stability across the wider southeast asian region it emphasizes the role of international capital flows in the unfolding of the global cold war showing how suharto mobilized international aid and investment to construct his new order dictatorship

for those who lived through the cold war period and for many of the historians who study it it seemed self evident that the critical incidents that determined its course took place in the northern hemisphere specifically in the face off between nato and the warsaw pact in europe in this view the berlin wall mattered more than the ho chi minh trail and the soviet intervention in hungary was vastly more significant than soviet intervention in korea it was only the fine balance of power in the northern theatre that redirected the attentions of the usa and the ussr elsewhere and resulted in outbreaks of proxy warfare elsewhere in the globe in korea in vietnam and in africa odd arne westad s triumph is to look at the history of these times through the other end of the telescope to reconceptualize the cold war as something that fundamentally happened in the third world not the first the thesis he presents in the global cold war is highly creative it upends much conventional wisdom and points out that the determining factor in the struggle was not geopolitics but ideology an ideology moreover that was heavily flavoured by elements of colonialist thinking that ought to have been alien to the mindsets of two avowedly anti colonial superpowers westad s work is a fine example of the creative thinking skill of coming up with new connections and fresh solutions it also never shies away from generating new hypotheses or redefining issues in order to see them in new ways

cold war was a term coined in 1945 by left leaning british writer george orwell to predict how powers made unconquerable by having nuclear weapons would conduct future relations it was popularized in 1947 by american journalist walter lippmann amid mounting tensions between the erstwhile world war ii allies the capitalist democracies the united states of america and britain versus the soviet union a communist dictatorship as the grand alliance of the big three they had defeated nazi germany its satellites and japan in world war ii but became rivals who split the world into an american led western bloc and soviet led eastern bloc both were secured from direct attack by arraying ever greater nuclear and conventional forces against the other while seeking global supremacy by other means the 45 year cold war lasted until the soviet union collapsed between 1989 and 1991 this second edition of historical dictionary of the cold war contains a chronology an introduction and an extensive bibliography the dictionary section has over 400 cross referenced entries on important personalities crucial countries and peripheral conflicts the increasingly lethal weapons systems and the various political and military strategies this book is an excellent resource for students researchers and anyone wanting to know more about this crucial period in history
