sentencing policies and practices in the 21st century focuses on the evolution and consequences of sentencing policies and practices with sentencing broadly defined to include plea bargaining judicial and juror decision making and alternatives to incarceration including participation in problem solving courts this collection of essays and reports of original research explores how sentencing policies and practices both in the united states and internationally have evolved explores important issues raised by guideline and non guideline sentencing and provides an overview of recent research on plea bargaining in the united states australia and the united kingdom other topics include the role of criminal history in sentencing the past and future of capital punishment strategies for reducing mass incarceration problem solving courts and restorative justice practices each chapter summarizes what is known identifies the gaps in the research and discusses the theoretical empirical and policy implications of the research findings the volume is grounded in current knowledge about the specific topics but also presents new material that reflects the thinking of the leading minds in the field and that outlines a research agenda for the future this is volume 4 of the american society of criminology s division on corrections and sentencing handbook series previous volumes focused on risk assessment disparities in punishment and the consequences of punishment decisions the handbooks provide a comprehensive overview of these topics for scholars students practitioners and

community home and identity are concepts that have concerned scholars in a variety of fields for some time legal scholars sociologists anthropologists psychologists and economists among others have studied the impacts of home and community on one's identity and how one's identity is manifested in one's home and in one's community this volume brings together some of the leading thinkers about the connections between community home and identity several chapters address how the law and lawyers contribute or detract from the creation and maintenance of community and in some cases the conscious destruction of communities others examine the protection of individual and group identities through rules related to property title and use of such things as home and identity property

prioritize one directional knowledge dissemination provides a broad context of anti black oppression that highlights the united states but also discussing antiblackness globally inviting readers to engage with the text from their unique vantage points

a rich collection of interdisciplinary essays this book explores the question what is to be found at the intersection of the sensorium and law s empire examining the problem of how legal rationalities try to grasp what can only be sensed through the body these essays problematize the cartesian framework that has long separated the mind from the body reason from feeling and the human from the animal in doing so they consider how the sensorium can operate variously as a tool of power or as a means of countering the exercise of regulatory force the senses it is argued operate as a vector for the implication of subjects in legal webs but also as a powerful site of resistance to legal definition and determination from the sensorium of animals to technologically mediated perception the ways in which the law senses and the ways in which senses are brought before the law invite a questioning of the categories of liberal humanism and as this volume demonstrates this questioning opens up the both interesting and important possibility of imagining other sensual subjectivities
