photocopy anything you don't need to spend a fortune at the stationery shop or hours on pre class preparation just read the instructions and you are ready to go they're quick every activity displays a set up time which tells the teacher how long the activity will take to set up in the classroom this even allows the book to be referenced quickly in class during those lesson gap emergencies when a class runs short the overarching themes of this book are student empowerment after the teacher has initially organized an activity one or two times many of the activities can be handed over to the students to plan organize and run themselves this greatly increases the opportunity for the students to use english for a functional purpose how english is used naturally rather than a display purpose what i call textbook english teacher monitoring this book often emphasises the importance of teacher monitoring when the teacher hands over the responsibility for the running of an activity to the students they are effectively stepping out of the circle what this allows the teacher to do is to really get down to observing their students using english for communicative purposes the teacher will be able to assess how well the students are using the language structures they have been taught and plan for error correction strategies in post activity classes the teacher will also be able to observe where the students are reaching the limits of their current language abilities which will aid them in the formation of future lesson plans

this short book is for you if you are considering going into the field of teaching english as a second foreign language whether english is your first native language or not i have written it with those who are contemplating pursuing english teaching esl efl or esol as a career option particularly in mind but it would also be of interest to individuals who might be thinking about engaging in english teaching on a short term or voluntary basis my purpose in writing this book is to help you decide whether or not teaching english as a second foreign language is something you might want to pursue based upon my own experience of teaching english as a second language and my knowledge of the english language teaching field more broadly i discuss what it is like in practical terms to be an esl efl esol teacher what the job involves and what to expect beyond the practicalities to give some insight into how efl teachers think about their task the skills qualities and knowledge needed to be an esl efl esol teacher the kind of opportunities available i also give some ideas about where to begin with getting into english teaching and i provide recommendations on how to find out more about the field although the focus of this book is the teaching of the english language much of what is written will be equally relevant to teaching any language so if english is not your first language and you are interested in teaching your native language to those who do not know it this book is for you too
